PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Terrance M. Scheid, M.D. (DOB 05/31/49) is duly licensed to practice medicine and surgery in the state of Wisconsin (license #20-33838) This license was first granted on October 21, 1992. Dr. Scheid's specialty is obstetrics and gynecology.
2. Dr. Scheid's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board is 619 Samuel Drive, Madison, WI 53717.
3. On July 21, 2004, the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board issued an order that required Dr. Scheid to obtain board approval prior to practicing in the State of Wisconsin and also placed conditions on his practice of medicine in Wisconsin. This action was based on a reprimand issued by the State of Minnesota Board of Medical Practice on July 12, 2003.
4. On March 8, 2004, the Medical Board of California, Department of Consumer Affairs issued an Order concerning the license of Dr. Scheid to practice medicine and surgery in the State of California. This action was based on an altered letter on Medical Board of California stationary submitted by Respondent to a hospital in Missouri when Respondent applied for appointment to the hospital's medical staff. The altered language stated that there is no evidence to support an allegation of

substandard care while the original letter stated that there is evidence to support an allegation of substandard care. A copy of the California action is attached as Exhibit A.

5. The Respondent contends that the submission of the altered letter to the hospital in Missouri was an accident and the Respondent had intended to submit an unaltered copy of the letter to the Missouri hospital. The Respondent also contends that the letter was altered months earlier as part of a project in a computer class.

6. In resolution of this matter, Dr. Scheid consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Medical Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 448.02(3), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. The conduct described in paragraph 4, above, constitutes a basis for the imposition of discipline pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § Med 10.02(2)(q).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Wisconsin license to practice medicine and surgery of Terrance M. Scheid, M.D. (license #20-33838) is LIMITED as provided in Wis. Stat. § 448.02(3)(e) and as follows:

1. Until otherwise ordered by the Board, Respondent shall refrain from the clinical practice of medicine in Wisconsin or the clinical practice of medicine elsewhere under his Wisconsin license. The clinical practice of medicine is the examination, diagnosis or treatment of individual patients or consultation for the same. The Respondent may continue to operate his consulting business which involves the review of utilization patterns of physician requested studies and comparison of those utilization patterns with payment standards set by third party payers.

2. After two years from the date of this Order, Respondent may petition the Board for permission to practice under his Wisconsin license.

3. In conjunction with any such petition, the Board may: a) Require the Respondent to provide proof that he is able to safely and competently practice; b) Require evidence of the status of his license in other jurisdictions; c) Require a personal appearance by Respondent to answer questions in conjunction with the petition; and, d) If the petition is granted, impose such terms, conditions and limitations as the Board in the exercise of its discretion finds appropriate to safeguard the public health, safety and welfare.

4. Respondent shall, within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, pay costs of this proceeding in the amount of FIVE HUNDRED dollars (\$500.00). Payment shall be made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing, and mailed to:

4. In the event Respondent fails to timely pay costs as ordered, Respondent's license (#20-33838) SHALL BE SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with the terms of this Order. The Board or its designee will remove the suspension, if provided with sufficient information that Respondent is in compliance with the Order and that it is inappropriate for the suspension to remain in effect. The Board in its discretion may impose additional conditions and limitations for a violation of any of the terms of this Order.

5. Respondent is responsible for compliance with all of the terms and conditions of this Final Decision and Order.

This Order shall become effective on the date of its signing.
