PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter subject to the approval of the Department. The Department has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Department in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Robert L. Harris (Date of Birth: May 17, 1969) was licensed as a real estate salesperson in the state of Wisconsin (License #54803) by the Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing (hereinafter Department). On May 23, 2002 the Department issued its Order Adopting the Stipulation and a limited license was issued on May 24, 2002. The license was revo on February 12, 2004 because Mr. Harris failed to comply with the terms of the Order.
- 2. On or about June 7, 2007, Mr. Harris filed a reinstatement application for a real estate salesperson license with the Department.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 452.05(1)(a).
- 2. The facts and circumstances substantially relate to the practice of a real estate salesperson. Applicant by his conduct is subject to action against his license pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 452.14(3).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that ROBERT L. HARIS is GRANTED a REAL ESTATE SALESPERSON'S LICENSE, subject to the following LIMITATIONS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

Sobriety

- 1. Applicant shall abstain from all personal use of alcohol and controlled substances as defined in § 961.01(4), Stat., except when prescribed, dispensed or administered by a health care practitioner for a legitimate medical condition. Applicant shall disclose Applicant's drug and alcohol history and the existence and nature of this Order to the practitioner prior to the practitioner ordering the controlled substance. Applicant shall at the time the controlled substance is ordered immediately sign a release in compliance with state and federal laws authorizing the practitioner to discuss Applicant's treatment with, and provide copies of treatment records to, Treatment Provider and the Department or Department Monitor.
- Applicant shall refrain from the consumption of over-the-counter medications or other substances which may mask
 consumption of controlled substances or of alcohol, create false positive screening results, or interfere with Applicant's
 treatment and rehabilitation.

Drug and Alcohol Screens

- 3. Within thirty (30) days of this Order, Applicant shall enroll and begin participation in a drug and alcohol monitoring program which is approved by the Department ("Approved Program"). A list of Approved Programs pursuant to Wis. Adm. Code § RL 7.11 is available from the Department Monitor.
- 4. At the time Applicant enrolls in an Approved Program, Applicant shall review all of the rules and procedures made available by the Approved Program. Failure to comply with all requirements for participation in drug and alcohol monitoring established by the Approved Program is a violation of this Order. The requirements shall include:
 - (a.) Contact with the Approved Program as directed on a daily basis, including vacations, weekends and holidays.
 - (b.) Production of a urine specimen at a collection site designated by the Approved Program within five (5) hours of notification of a test.
- 5. Applicant is responsible for obtaining urine screens at a frequency of not less then one every other week. The frequency may be reduced only upon a determination by the Department or Department Monitor pursuant to Applicant submitting a petition for modification of the terms of this Order.
- 6. If any urine, blood or hair specimen is positive or suspected positive for any controlled substances or alcohol, Applicant shall promptly submit to additional tests or examinations as the treatment provider or the Department or Department Monitor shall determine to be appropriate to clarify or confirm the positive or suspected positive test results.
- 7. In addition to any requirement of the Approved Program, the Department or Department Monitor may require Applicant to: (a) submit additional urine specimens, (b) submit blood, hair or breath specimens, or (c) furnish any specimen in a directly witnessed manner.
- 8. All confirmed positive test results shall be presumed to be valid. Applicant must prove by a preponderance of the evidence an error in collection, testing or other fault in the chain of custody.
- 9. The Approved Program shall submit information and reports to Department Monitor in compliance with the requirements of Wis. Adm. Code § RL 7.11. The Approved Program shall immediately report to treatment provider all specimens suspected to have been tampered with or which are positive or suspected positive for controlled substances or alcohol.

Releases

10. Applicant shall provide and keep on file with all facilities and personnel, laboratories and collections sites and (if applicable) treatment provider(s) current releases complying with state and federal laws. The releases shall allow the Department, its designee, and any employee of the Department of Regulation and Licensing, Division of Enforcement to: (a) obtain all urine, blood and hair specimen screen results and patient health care and treatment records and reports, and (b) discuss these results and records with relevant personnel. Copies of these releases shall immediately be filed with Department Monitor.

Practice Limitations

11. Applicant shall practice real estate only under the general supervision of a Wisconsin licensed real estate broker approved by the Department or Department Monitor.

Reporting Requirements

- 12. Applicant shall provide a copy of this Final Decision and Order to supervisory personnel at all settings where Applicant works as a real estate salesperson and (if applicable) to his treatment provider.
- 13. It is Applicant's responsibility to arrange for written reports from his real estate supervisor(s) to be provided to Department Monitor on a quarterly basis, as directed by Department Monitor. These reports shall describe the

- Respondent's sales activities and verify that he is in compliance with the laws governing the practice of real estate and the terms of this Order.
- 14. Applicant shall report to the Department any change of employment status, residence, address or telephone number within five (5) days of the date of a change.
- 15. Applicant is responsible for compliance with all of the terms and conditions of this Order, including the timely submission of reports by others. Applicant shall promptly notify Department Monitor of any suspected violations of any of the terms and conditions of this Order by Applicant

Department Monitor

16. The Department Monitor is the individual designated by the Department as its agent to coordinate compliance with the terms of this Order. Any requests, petitions, reports and other information required by this Order shall be mailed, faxed or delivered to:

Petitions for Modification

17. Applicant may petition the Department for modification of the terms of this Order after two years from the effective date of this order. Any such petition shall be accompanied by a written recommendation from Applicant's employer and (if applicable) his treatment provider expressly supporting the specific modifications sought. Denial of a petition in whole or in part shall not be considered a denial of a license within the meaning of Wis. Stats. § 227.01(3)(a), and Applicant shall not have a right to any further hearings or proceedings on the denial.

Costs

18. Applicant shall be responsible for all costs and expenses incurred in conjunction with the monitoring, screening, supervision and any other expenses associated with compliance with the terms of this Order. Being dropped from a program for non-payment is a violation of this Order.

Summary Suspension / Additional Discipline

- 19. Any further conviction (felony or misdemeanor including DWI or OWI) **OR** violation of any state or local law that is punishable by a forfeiture shall result in the revocation of Applicant's license.
- 20. The Department may revoke without further notice or hearing or other proceeding Applicant's permit for failure by Applicant to timely comply with the terms of this Order and/or any further criminal conviction. A violation of this Order may alternatively be the basis for a summary suspension under Wis. Admin. Code § RL 6 or for separate disciplinary action under Wis. Stat. § 440.26(6).
