On February 7, 2007, the State of Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board reviewed a petition and supporting evidence submitted by Robert J. Kunde, R.Ph., in support of a request for the granting of a three month stay of suspension as provided within the board’s *Final Decision and Order*, (“*Order*”) dated October 19, 2005, in case number LS 0510191 PHM. Also requested was 1) a reduction in individual/group therapy sessions as required by paragraph C.4, of the *Order* to two times per month, (currently four times per month); 2) 8 hours per week of work as a pharmacist in charge pursuant to paragraph C.22., of the *Order*, (currently 0 hours); and 3) permission to open the Columbia St. Mary ‘s hospital pharmacy as a pharmacist in charge. Based upon the board's review of the petition and the documents submitted, the board orders as follows:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED: that Robert J. Kunde, is granted a three-month stay of the suspension of license #8830 to practice pharmacy in the State of Wisconsin.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: that the request for a reduction in individual/group therapy sessions as required by paragraph C.4 of the *Order*, to two times per month, is granted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED: that Kunde is granted eight (8) hours of work per week as a pharmacist in charge at Columbia St. Mary ‘s hospital pharmacy and that Kunde may open that pharmacy.
