PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Pharmacy Examining Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Ronald J. Collard, R.Ph., (DOB 07/10/1960) is duly licensed as a pharmacist in the state of Wisconsin (license #40-11384). This license was first granted on March 22, 1990.
2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board is 3302 Rambling Rose Drive, Appleton, WI 54914.
3. At all times relevant to this action, Respondent was working as a pharmacist at Osco Drug #8525 (license #42-8666), 1800 W. College Avenue, Appleton, Wisconsin.
4. On or about May 16, 2006, Respondent submitted a Pharmacy License Application to the Department. On page 2 the application asks "Has the managing pharmacist listed on this application ever had a pharmacist license limited, suspended, revoked or reprimanded in this or any other state?" Respondent answered "No".

5. Respondent failed to disclose that he was reprimanded by the Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board on February 9, 1999 for failure to provide a prescription consult.

6. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 450.10, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order, pursuant to Wis. Stat. 227.44(5).

2. The conduct described in paragraphs 4 and 5, above, constitutes a violation of Wisconsin Administrative Code § Phar 10.03(8) and Wis. Stat. § 450.10(1)(a)1.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Ronald J. Collard, R.Ph. (license #40-11384) is hereby REPRIMANDED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

2. Respondent shall, within 60 days from the date of this Order, pay a forfeiture of two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00) and partial costs of this proceeding in the amount of two hundred fifty (\$250.00) dollars. Payment shall be made to the Department of Regulation and Licensing, 1400 E. Washington Avenue, P.O. Box 8935, Madison, Wisconsin 53708-8935.

3. In the event the Respondent fails to pay the forfeiture and costs as ordered the Respondent's license SHALL BE SUSPENDED without further notice or hearing, until the Respondent has complied with the terms of this Order.

4. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.
