PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Pharmacy Examining Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Robert A. Tamblyn, R.Ph., (DOB 07/21/1947) is duly licensed as a pharmacist in the state of Wisconsin (license #40-10259). This license was granted on June 4, 1982.
2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board is 810 S. 4th Street, De Kalb, IL 60115.
3. On Respondent's April 19, 2006 licensure renewal application, he signed a statement that he had completed the required continuing education for the biennium beginning June 1, 2004 and ending May 31, 2006.
4. On or about October 19, 2006, a representative of the Department contacted Respondent to inform him that he was 3 credits short of the required continuing education.

5. On or about October 25, 2006, Respondent, whose primary state of practice is Illinois, wrote a letter to the Department explaining that he had forgotten that Wisconsin used a biennium calendar year. Therefore, Respondent submitted 3 credits, two of which were taken on October 17, 2006 and one which was taken on October 25, 2006, all outside of Wisconsin's biennium period.

6. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 450.10, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. The conduct described in paragraph 3 through 5, above, constitutes a violation of Wis. Stat. §§ 450.085 and 450.10(1)(a)1. and subjects Respondent to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. 450.10(1)(b).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Robert A. Tamblyn, R.Ph. (license #40-10830), is hereby REPRIMANDED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

2. Respondent shall, within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, pay a forfeiture of five hundred (\$500.00) dollars.

3. Respondent shall, within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, pay costs of this proceeding in the amount of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars.

4. Case number 07 PHM 020, shall be, and hereby is, closed without further proceedings.

5. The continuing education credits obtained in October 2006 to satisfy the 2004-2006 biennium requirement may not be applied to satisfying the 2006-2008 biennium requirement.

6. In the event the Respondent fails to pay the forfeiture or the costs as ordered the Respondent's license SHALL BE SUSPENDED until the Respondent has complied with the terms of this Order.

This Order shall become effective on the date of its signing.
