PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Pharmacy Examining Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Scot D. Peterson, R.Ph. (DOB 11/01/1958) is duly licensed as a pharmacist in the state of Wisconsin (license #40-10858). This license was granted on August 12, 1986.
2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board is 1000 S. Harbor Island Blvd. #2610, Tampa, FL 33602.
3. On Respondent's May 15, 2006 licensure renewal application, he signed a statement that he had completed the required continuing education for the biennium beginning June 1, 2004 and ending May 31, 2006.
4. In October 2006, a representative of the Department contacted Respondent to inform him that he was 11.5 credits short of the required continuing education due to a missing certificate and credits submitted being outside of the biennium

period.

5. On or about November 16, 2006, Respondent, whose primary state of practice is Florida, responded with a letter to the Department explaining that he is registered in three states having three different completion deadlines and therefore his credits hours follow his Florida license biennium period. Therefore 6 credits were submitted from November 14, 2006. Respondent also stated he was unable to retrieve a copy of a certificate for 7 hours due to problems with a CE sponsor's website.

6. In April 2008, Respondent submitted proof of 4 qualifying continuing education credits obtained on May 14, 2005 and 2 credits obtained on May 26, 2007. These credits along with the 6 credits referred to in paragraph 5, above, satisfy the 11.5 credit shortage for the June 1, 2004 to May 31, 2006 biennium period.

7. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 450.10, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. The conduct described in paragraphs 3 through 5, above, constitutes a violation of Wis. Stat. §§ 450.085 and 450.10(1)(a)1. and subjects Respondent to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 450.10(1)(b).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Scot D. Peterson, R.Ph. (license #40-10858), is hereby REPRIMANDED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

2. Respondent shall, within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, pay a forfeiture of two hundred fifty (\$250.00) dollars.

3. Respondent shall, within ninety (90) days from the date of this Order, pay costs of this proceeding in the amount of one hundred (\$100.00) dollars.

4. Case number 07 PHM 025, shall be, and hereby is, closed without further proceedings.

5. The 6 continuing education credits obtained in November 2006 and 2 credits obtained in May 2007 to satisfy the 2004-2006 biennium requirement may not be applied to satisfy the 2006-2008 biennium requirement.

6. In the event the Respondent fails to pay the forfeiture or the costs as ordered the Respondent's license SHALL BE

SUSPENDED until the Respondent has complied with the terms of this Order.

This Order shall become effective on the date of its signing.
