#### PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Veterinary Examining Board. The Board has reviewed the attached Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

#### **FINDINGS OF FACT**

- 1. John K. Barnstorff, D.V.M., Respondent herein, whose date of birth is September 6, 1962, is duly licensed by the Wisconsin Veterinary Examining Board to practice veterinary medicine in the State of Wisconsin pursuant to license number 3171, which was first granted on August 11, 1988.
- 2. Respondent's last address reported to the Department of Regulation and Licensing is 3643 Glenbrooke Lane, Green Bay, WI 54301.
- 3. At all times relevant to this action, Respondent was working as a veterinarian at the Animal Hospital of DePere in DePere, Wisconsin.
- 4. On December 15, 2004, a 13-year-old male cat owned by Bradley Heyrman began having trouble breathing while out on his usual walk and continued having difficulty breathing throughout the night.
- 5. On December 16, 2004, Mr. Heyrman brought his cat to Respondent's clinic for evaluation. Respondent examined the cat and took x-rays. Respondent believed the most likely diagnoses were pneumonia or neoplasia and started the cat on a therapeutic trial of antibiotics.

- 6. Mr. Heyrman took his cat home and attempted to administer the antibiotics, which proved to be very difficult.
- 7. At approximately 4:30 p.m. on December 17, 2004, Mr. Heyrman brought his cat back to Respondent's clinic because the cat's condition was worsening. Respondent examined the cat and in his records, noted "labored breathing/open mouth breathing/panting, nervous during PE, O having difficulty giving meds. . . PE-dyspnea seems more pronounced, open mouth breathing. Lungs have more severe crackles than yesterday. Laid on floor in lateral recumbency w/ dyspnea." There was also a subnormal temperature, while it was normal the previous day.
- 8. Respondent alleges he provided options to the owner of further testing, referral or an antibiotic trial. The owner disputes that these options were given and states that Respondent discussed putting the cat in an oxygen tent but did not explain to him how that would help or Respondent could refer him to a specialist but did not provide a name or make the referral. Mr. Heyrman alleges that Respondent stated that Mr. Heyrman should take the cat home and continue the antibiotic therapy.
- 9. The Heyrman cat was in critical condition and required immediate intervention, including hospitalization and ongoing monitoring. Antibiotic therapy alone was not a viable option for treatment at this time.
- 10. Mr. Heyrman took the cat home and by 5:30 p.m., the cat was choking and foaming at the mouth. Mr. Heyrman called Respondent's clinic, which was closed. The answering service directed callers to the Green Bay Animal Emergency Center (GBAEC).
  - 11. Respondent had not provided Mr. Heyrman with option of referral to GBAEC during the office visit.
  - 12. During the trip GBAEC, the Heyrman cat had a seizure and died.
- 13. Respondent failed to adequately evaluate the condition of the Heyrman cat and appropriately advise the owner of the seriousness of that condition and the viable treatment options.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Wisconsin Veterinary Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. sec. 453.07(2), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order, pursuant to Wis. Stat. sec. 227.44(5).
- 2. Respondent's conduct, as set out above, is a violation of Wis. Admin. Code sec. VE 7.06(1) and he is therefore subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. sec. 453.07(1)(f).

### **ORDER**

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Stipulation of the parties is hereby accepted.

#### IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

- 1. The license of John K. Barnstorff, D.V.M., Respondent, to practice veterinary medicine in the State of Wisconsin shall be limited to require that, within nine (9) months of the date of this Order, Respondent shall obtain a total of four (4) hours of continuing education in the diagnosis and treatment of the causes of lung diseases, with an emphasis on dyspnea. The course(s) attended in satisfaction of this requirement may not be used to satisfy the statutory continuing education requirements for licensure.
- 2. Respondent shall be responsible for obtaining the course(s) required under this Order, for providing adequate course descriptions to the Department Monitor, and for obtaining pre-approval of the course(s) from the Wisconsin Veterinary Examining Board, or its designee, prior to commencement of the program(s).
- 3. Within thirty (30) days following completion of the courses identified in paragraph 1 above, Respondent shall file with the Department Monitor certifications from the sponsoring organization(s) verifying his attendance at the required course(s).
  - 4. All costs of the educational program(s) shall be the responsibility of Respondent.
- 5. Upon successful completion of the educational program(s), submission and approval of the records and payment of the costs set forth below, Respondent's license to practice veterinary medicine shall be restored to unlimited status.

## IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

6. Respondent shall, within 90 days of the date of this Order pay costs of this proceeding in the amount of eight hundred and two (\$802.00) dollars. Payment shall be made to the Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing, and mailed or delivered to:

7. In the event that Respondent fails to pay costs as ordered or fails to comply with the ordered continuing education, Respondent's license (#3171) SHALL BE SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with the terms of this Order.
