PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Jacqueline Marie Hildreth (D.O.B. 9/24/62) is duly licensed in the state of Wisconsin as a professional nurse (license #129543). This license was first granted on 6/19/98. Respondent is also licensed in North Carolina.
- 2. As part of a pre-employment physical for a nursing position, Respondent's urine was tested on 3/18/05, and was positive for cannabinoids. Respondent did not have a prescription for dronabinol, a Schedule III controlled substance, or other authority to have consumed dronabinol or marijuana, a Schedule I controlled substance. The Board infers that Respondent consumed marijuana for non-medical purposes, and Respondent admits this.
- 3. As a result of the above incident, Respondent was disciplined by the North Carolina Board of Nursing, by surrendering her practice privileges as a practical and professional nurse on 7/27/05; she retains her license but must petition the Board for permission to practice.
- 4. Respondent has no other disciplinary, criminal or traffic record, and subsequent routine urine testing by other employers has been negative. She has cooperated with the investigation, and accepted responsibility for her actions.

CONCLUSION OF LAW

By the conduct described above, respondent is subject to disciplinary action against her license to practice as a registered nurse in the state of Wisconsin, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1)(b) and (d), and Wis. Adm. Code § N 7.04(1) and (15).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

- Respondent Jacqueline M. Hildreth, R.N., is REPRIMANDED for her unprofessional conduct in this matter.
- 2. Respondent shall, upon request of the Board or its designee, or any agent of the Board or its designee (which may include a law enforcement officer) provide a sample of her breath, blood, urine, or hair for testing. This provision shall not be deemed a limitation on Respondent's license, but violation shall be subject to action pursuant to par. 3, below.
- 3. Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Respondent's license. The Board in its discretion may in the alternative impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that respondent shall pay the costs of investigating and prosecuting this matter, in the amount of \$700, by 1/5/10. If not paid, Respondent's license shall be SUSPENDED without further notice or hearing, until they are paid in full, together with any accrued interest.
