PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board of Nursing. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Jennifer M. Johnson, R.N. (DOB November 23, 1961) is duly licensed to practice as a registered nurse in the State of Wisconsin (license #30-150543, granted on May 4, 2005). The license expired on February 29, 2008, but absent Board action, may be renewed for a period of five years.
- 2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Board of Nursing is 3384 Daley Center Drive #515, Sai Diego, CA 92123.
- 3. At all times relevant to the facts set out in Finding of Fact 4, Respondent was employed as a registered nurse at Al Saints Healthcare, 3801 Spring Street, Racine, Wisconsin.
- 4. In June 2005, Respondent diverted and self-administered controlled drugs from her workplace.
- 5. In January 2006, Respondent obtained prescription drugs without a valid prescription in Kenosha, Wisconsin.
- 6. Based on the events in paragraphs 4 and 5, above, on May 10, 2006, Respondent was charged with 4 counts o Obtaining Prescription Drug by Fraud, Wis. Stat. § 450.11(7)(a), a Class U misdemeanor. Respondent was put on a deferred

prosecution program for 12 months and charges were dismissed July 9, 2007.

- 7. Respondent has moved out-of-state and states that she is no longer practicing as a registered nurse and is pursuing other options.
- 8. Respondent consents to the issuance of the following Conclusions of Law and Order in resolution of this matter.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction over this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1) and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).
- 2. The conduct described in paragraphs 4 and 5, above, constitutes a basis for discipline and violates Wis. Stat. \(441.07(1)(c) \) and Wis. Admin. Code \(\} N 7.04(2).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that;

- 1. The Board of Nursing ACCEPTS the voluntary SURRENDER of the license and of all rights to renew the license, of Jennifer M. Johnson, R.N. (license #30-150543) to practice as a registered nurse in the State of Wisconsin. Respondent shall immediately return all indicia of Wisconsin Licensure to the Department Monitor, Post Office Box 8935, Madison, WI 53708-8935.
- 2. The Respondent shall not request reinstatement or re-apply for a license to practice as a nurse in the State of Wisconsin for a period of 2 years from the date of this Order.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that;

- 3. In the event Respondent shall ever request reinstatement or re-apply for a license to practice as a nurse in the State of Wisconsin, she shall, in addition to all other requirements for licensure, demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Board of Nursing that she does not have a chemical dependence, and that she can safely and reliably perform nursing functions.
- 4. In the event that Respondent shall ever request reinstatement or re-apply for a license to practice in the State of Wisconsin, the Board may determine whether, and under what terms and conditions, such request may be granted.
- 5. Respondent shall not practice as a registered nurse or attempt to practice as a registered nurse, in the State of Wisconsin, without being licensed and registered.
- 6. If Respondent ever petitions for reinstatement or applies for any license or privilege from the board, she shall pay the costs of investigating and prosecuting this matter, in the amount of FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$400.00), before such petition or application may be considered.

The rights of a party aggrieved by this Decision to petition the Board for rehearing and to petition for judicial review are set forth on the attached "Notice of Appeal Information".

This Order shall become effective upon the date of its signing.
