On May 7, 2009, the Board of Nursing considered the petitioner's request for full reinstatement of her nursing license which had expired in 1988. Petitioner had previously applied for reinstatement in 2006 and was granted a limited license to complete a nurse refresher course. The information of record shows that Petitioner did not complete the nurse refresher course.

The information presented in support of the request for full reinstatement consisted of documentation of work in the field of occupational health services involving wellness services and does not demonstrate continued competence in the practice of nursing, a prerequisite to credential renewal under s. N 5.08, Wis. Admin. Code.

Accordingly, the Board now finds and makes the following:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the request for full reinstatement of the license of MARY L. OUTCALT (lic. # 47823-30) to practice as a registered nurse is hereby DENIED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in lieu of further proceedings, the petitioner shall be issued a LIMITED license to complete a board-approved nurse refresher course. The LIMITED license shall be valid for a period of one (1) year from the date of issuance.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that if you do not chose to complete a board-approved refresher course, you may request a hearing on the denial of your application of full licensure if you file a written request for hearing within 30 days after the date on which this Notice of Intent to Deny Renewal is mailed. Your request must be submitted in writing to the: Department of Regulation and Licensing, Division of Professional Credential Processing, 1400 East Washington Avenue, PO Box 8935, Madison, WI 53708 8935.

The request for a hearing must contain your name and address, the type of credential of which you have applied, a specific description of the mistake in fact or law that you assert was made in the denial of your credential, and a concise statement of the essential facts which you intend to prove at the hearing. You will be notified in writing of the decision on whether or not a hearing will be granted.
