PROCEDURAL HISTORY

A disciplinary proceeding was commenced in this matter by the filing of a Notice of Hearing and Complaint with the Board on 10/30/08. Prior to the hearing on the Complaint, the parties in this matter agreed to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Peggy Jean Holt (D.O.B. 4/21/48) is duly licensed in the state of Wisconsin as a professional nurse (license #155848). This license was first granted on 7/17/06, by endorsement. Respondent is or has been licensed in Michigan (under her birth name of Peggy Jean Morgan), Colorado (under her former name of Peggy Jean Dean), Louisiana (under her former name of Peggy Valero-Richardson), and Texas (under her former name of Peggy Jean Valero).

2. On 6/10/06, Respondent applied for licensure by endorsement to the Wisconsin Board of Nursing, and made the following statement in response to a question about whether she had ever been disciplined by another state:

In Sept. 2000 my Father was diagnosed with terminal cancer, because I was not married and no children at Home I sold my home and moved to Michigan to take care of my parents until I could return to work. I sent my license back to the board of nursing or surrendered my license since I would not be returning to Tx.

3. In fact, Respondent has the following disciplinary history in Texas, where she was licensed on 11/3/89:

On 9/30/99, Respondent stipulated to, and on 10/28/99, the Board issued, an order finding that she had reported for work as a hospital staff nurse with the odor of an intoxicating beverage upon her breath and, on a separate occasion, had administered a dose of a blood pressure medication which was triple the ordered dose, and had failed to take the

patient's blood pressure and pulse before administering the medication. Respondent was reprimanded, and ordered to obtain the following continuing education: 6 hours in nursing jurisprudence, 6 hours in medication administration plus 24 hours of followup supervised clinical practice, and 6 hours in nursing documentation. Respondent's license was limited for one year in the following respects: her practice was limited to require that she provide a copy of the order to any employer for whom she practiced clinical nursing and to report such employment to the Board; she was required to practice only under the supervision of another professional nurse and forbidden to work as an agency or home health nurse or to be self-employed as a nurse; her employers were required to submit quarterly reports; and she was required to submit to urine drug and alcohol screening.

On 11/29/01, Respondent agreed to, and on 12/11/01, the Board issued, an Order finding that Respondent had, on 2/25/01, while employed as a hospital nurse in Texas, appeared for work with alcohol in her body. The Board accepted Respondent's surrender of her license, and required that if she ever petitioned for reinstatement, she demonstrate 12 months of uninterrupted sobriety.

### CONCLUSION OF LAW

By the conduct described above, respondent is subject to disciplinary action against her license to practice as a registered nurse in the state of Wisconsin, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1)(a).

### ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that, effective the date of this Order, the SURRENDER of the license to practice nursing of Peggy J. Holt, R.N., is ACCEPTED. Respondent shall not practice nursing in Wisconsin, including under the Nurse Licensure Compact, without a Wisconsin license.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Respondent shall pay the costs of investigating and prosecuting this matter, in the amount of \$500.
