PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Pharmacy Examining Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Thomas J. Hallingstad, R.Ph., Respondent, date of birth November 16, 1946, is licensed by the Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board as a pharmacist in the state of Wisconsin pursuant to license number 8173, which was first granted on June 24, 1971.
- 2. Respondent's address of record with the Department of Regulation and Licensing (DRL) is 3230 Sheard Road, Burlington, WI 53105.
- 3. At all times relevant to this action, Respondent was working as a pharmacist at Aurora Pharmacy, 700 N. Lake Avenue, Twin Lakes, WI 53181.
- 4. On May 25, 2006, a DRL investigator witnessed multiple transactions at Aurora Pharmacy, 700 N. Lake Avenue, Twin Lakes, during which Respondent, the pharmacist on duty, permitted an unlicensed clerk to transfer prescriptions to patients without consultation with a licensed pharmacist.
- 5. The DRL investigator asked the clerk how the clerk typically handled prescription transfers. The clerk explained that she asked the customer's name, retrieved the bag containing the prescription, had the customer sign for the drug and she, the clerk, conveyed the prescription to the customer. She said that if a prescription is new (not a refill), she would arrange for a consultation with the pharmacist. The clerk said she was unaware that a pharmacist was supposed to do consultations and transfer prescriptions.

- The DRL investigator discussed the consultation and dispensing issue with Respondent. He said he was aware that he was supposed to do consultations and dispensing, but that the work flow had changed with the recent sale of the pharmacy and the change had disrupted systems that had been in place.
- The Pharmacy Examining Board requires pharmacists to provide consultation with every prescription, regardless of whether the prescription is new or a refill. The duty to consult is not satisfied by an offer to consult. The only exception to the consultation requirement for community pharmacies concerns prescriptions that are delivered to residences. None of the transactions witnessed by the DRL investigator on May 25, 2006 involved home-deliveries.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 450.10 and has authority to enter into this stipulated resolution of this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).
- The conduct described in paragraph 4 constitutes a violation of Wis. Admin. Code §§ Phar 7.01(1)(e) and (em), and subjects Respondent to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 450.10(1).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

- 1. Respondent, Thomas J. Hallingstad, R.Ph., is REPRIMANDED for the conduct set out above.
- Respondent shall, within 60 days from the date of this Order, pay to the Department of Regulation and Licensing a forfeiture in the amount of \$250.00, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 450.09(8).
- Respondent shall, within 60 days from the date of this Order, pay to the Department of Regulation and Licensing costs of this proceeding in the amount of \$340.00 pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.22(2).

- In the event Respondent fails to timely submit full payment of the forfeiture as set forth above, or fails to pay costs as ordered, Respondent's license may, in the discretion of the Board or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with the terms of this Order.

It is hereby stipulated and agreed, by and between Thomas J. Hallingstad, R.Ph., Respondent, and Sandra L. Nowack attorney for the Complainant, Department of Regulation and Licensing, Division of Enforcement, as follows:

- 1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation of Respondent's licensure by the Division o Enforcement (file 06 PHM 037). Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by stipulation and without the issuance of a formal complaint.
- 2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, he voluntarily and knowingly waives his rights, including the right to a hearing on the allegations against him, at which time the state has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to call witnesses on his behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena; the right to testify himself; the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision; the right to petition fo rehearing; and all other applicable rights afforded to him under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and any other provisions of state or federal law.
 - 3. Respondent has been provided an opportunity to obtain advice of legal counsel prior to signing this Stipulation.
- 4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Board. The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance o consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's Order, if adopted in the form as attached.
- 5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall be returned to the Division of Enforcement for further proceedings. In the event that this Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.
- 6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Enforcement and any member of the Board ever assigned as a case advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent or Respondent's attorney, if any, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with the Board's deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such case advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
- 7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.
- 8. The Division of Enforcement joins Respondent in recommending that the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
