On January 24, 2007 the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board (Board) issued a Final Decision and Order (Order) suspending the petitioner's license to practice as a physician and surgeon for an indefinite period, but provided the suspension shall be stayed subject to compliance with certain requirements. The requirements included individual and/or group therapy sessions, required random drug screens at the frequency of 96 times per year, and mandatory AA/NA meetings. The Board granted an initial stay of the suspension on July 27, 2007. Thereafter, the petitioner sought a reduction in the number of random drug screens.

On February 29, 2008, the Board granted the petitioner's request to modify the number of random drug screens by reducing the number of screens to 48 times per year until the petitioner returned to employment at which time the screens shall revert to 96 times per year. The Board granted an additional modification on November 6, 2009 reducing the number of drug screens to 28 times per year.

On November 17, 2010, the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board considered the petitioner's request for modification to reduce the number of his required random drug screens from 28 times per year to 14 times per year Based upon the information of record, the Board now finds and orders the following:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the request for modification of the limited license of Joel C. Jacobson, M.D., (#20-29643) to reduce the number of random drug screens from 28 times per year to 14 times per year, be and hereby is, GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the number of random drug screens shall increase to 96 times per year once the petitioner returns to employment in the medical field.

The effective date of this Order is November 17, 2010.
