On June 3, 2010, the Wisconsin Board of Nursing considered the petitioner's request for reinstatement of her nursing license which she surrendered pursuant to the Final Decision and Order of the Board dated June 21, 2007. The Order provided that the petitioner could not reapply for licensure for a period of three years after the date of her surrender and only upon proof that she has been abstinent from drugs and alcohol for one year prior to her reapplication. Based upon the information of record which does not contain adequate current information regarding her compliance with the terms and conditions of the Order; and the fact that petitioner has consistently drug tested with low creatinine levels and had a recent drug screen that was found to be a dilute, the Board finds and makes the following:

ORDER


NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the request for reinstatement of the registered nurse license of KRISTINE M. KOHLMANN, R.N. (lic. # 102444) is hereby DENIED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that petitioner must provide the following additional information in support of a request for reinstatement of licensure:

1. Petitioner shall provide an explanation from her current health care provider for her consistently low creatinine levels.
2. Petitioner shall submit a hair specimen to the approved testing lab for a drug screen analysis.

3. Petitioner shall provide an AODA evaluation from her current treater with an opinion regarding her fitness to practice safely.
4. Petitioner shall enroll with Affinity, an approved drug testing program, for her random drug screens.
