On November 14, 2007, Medical Examining Board (Board) issued a Final Decision and Order suspending Dr. Milan Jordan's license to practice medicine and surgery, but immediately stayed the suspension subject to compliance with certain requirements. The requirements included, but were not limited to, random drug screens at a frequency of ninety-six (96) times per year.

On April 1, 2008, the Board reduced the petitioner's required random drug screens from ninety-six (96) times per year to fifty-six (56) times per year. On May 18, 2009, the Board reduced the petitioner's required random drug screens from fifty-six (56) times per year to twenty-six (26) times per year. The petitioner seeks a further reduction in his random drug screen requirement from twenty-six (26) times per year to twelve (12) times per year. Based upon the information of record, the Board now finds and orders the following:

ORDER


NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the request to reduce the random drug screening requirement of Milan Jordan, M.D., (#20-32315) be and hereby is, GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the random drug screening requirement shall be reduced from twenty-six (26) times per year to thirteen (13) times per year.

The effective date of this Order is September 15, 2010.
