The Pharmacy Examining Board considered this matter at its meeting on April 7, 2010.

BACKGROUND

On April 9, 2008, the Board issued a Final Decision and Order suspending Mr. Van Buren's license to practice as a pharmacist in the State of Wisconsin, Pharmacist license #12259, but staying that suspension subject to certain conditions. Specifically, paragraph C.4. requires weekly therapy sessions and paragraph C.22. restricts Mr. Van Buren from practicing as a pharmacist in charge unless there is permission of the Board.

On or about, March 11, 2010, Mr. Van Buren petitioned the Board to modify the Order by reducing the number of therapy sessions from every other week to one time per month and increasing the right to work as the pharmacist in charge from eight (8) hours to sixteen (16) hours per week.

Based upon all the information of record, the Board orders the following:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Mr. Van Buren's petition to reduce the number of therapy sessions to one (1) time per month, be and hereby is, Granted.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Mr. Van Buren's petition to increase the right to work to sixteen (16) hours per week as the pharmacist in charge, be and hereby is, Granted.

The effective date of this Order is April 7, 2010.
