PROCEDURAL HISTORY

On April 12, 2010, the Professional Counselor Section of the Wisconsin Marriage and Family Therapy, Professional Counseling, and Social Work Examining Board considered the applicant's request for an extension of her temporary license to practice as a professional counselor. Based upon the information presented, the Section makes the following determinations:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. The applicant, Vicki Marquardt, submitted an application for a license to practice as a professional counselor in the state of Wisconsin, on May 7, 2009.
2. On July 14, 2009, Ms. Marquardt was issued a temporary professional counselor license (#4235-125).
3. The professional counselor section may issue a temporary license to an individual who meets all the qualifications for the license except for passing the required examination. Per MPSW 11.035, Wis. Admin. Code, a temporary license expires nine months after its issuance or upon notification of failure of passing the required examination whichever occurs earlier.
4. On or about January 29, 2010, Ms. Marquardt submitted her registration application to take the National Counselor Exam to the National Board of Certified Counselors (NBCC). Upon subsequent communication with the NBCC, Ms. Marquardt was informed that her exam application paperwork had been misplaced.

5. This error by the NBBC prevented Ms. Marquardt from being able to take the exam in a timely fashion. In the interim, Ms. Marquardt's temporary license expired and she was rendered unable to continue her practice through no fault of her own.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Professional Counselors Section of the Wisconsin Marriage and Family Therapy, Professional Counseling, and Social Work Examining Board is the legal authority responsible for granting a professional counselor license pursuant to ch. 457, Wis. Stats, and has subject-matter jurisdiction over an application for licensure as a professional counselor.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the applicant, Vicki Marquardt, is hereby GRANTED a limited term training license (non-disciplinary), issued pursuant to 457.13, Stats., to practice as a professional counselor in the state of Wisconsin in a supervised clinical professional counselor practice.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that limited term training license shall expire one (1) year from the date of issuance or upon notification of her failure to pass the required examination under 467.12(4) Stats., whichever occurs earlier.
