Please take notice that under the authority of Wis. Stat. Chapters 227 and 444 and Wis. Admin. Code Chapters 192 to 196, the Department of Regulation and Licensing makes the following findings of fact, conclusions of law and order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Luis Ramirez is licensed as a professional Mixed Martial Artist in Wisconsin with license number 3-277.
2. Ramirez participated in the Bellator Fighting Championships, which was held on September 16, 2010. This event was held at the Rave (Eagles Ballroom) in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.
3. Ramirez suffered a knockout loss, at 30 seconds of Round 1, as determined by the referee.
4. Ramirez was subsequently directed by the ringside physician, that he must be examined and medically cleared by a physician before being allowed to compete as a Mixed Martial Artist.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

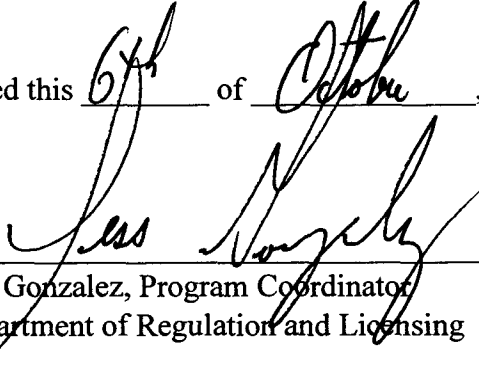
1. By suffering an injury as described in finding of fact 3, Ramirez is subject to a mandatory medical suspension of 60 days as required by Wis. Admin. Code sec. RL 196.02.
2. Pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code sec. RL 196.02 (3) and (4) a medical suspension shall not be cleared by the department until a contestant complies with all post-bout medical examination requirements.
3. The department has jurisdiction to take disciplinary action pursuant to Wis. Stat. Chaps. 227 and 444 and Wis. Admin. Code Chaps. 192 to 196.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the licensee of Mr. Ramirez is suspended for the mandatory period of 60 days, effective September 16, 2010, as required by Wis. Admin. Code sec. RL 196.02.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the medical suspension of the license of Mr. Ramirez may not be cleared by the department until after a medical examination is conducted and Mr. Ramirez is cleared to compete.
