PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board of Nursing. The Board has reviewed the attached Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Lolita Alexandra Sharpe, R.N., Respondent, date of birth April 23, 1974, is licensed by the Wisconsin Board of Nursing as a registered nurse in the state of Wisconsin pursuant to license number 30-129313, which was first granted April 29, 1998.
- 2. Respondent's last address reported to the Department of Regulation and Licensing is P.O. Box 1793, Kenosha, WI 53141.

- 3. On March 31, 2010, Respondent self-reported to the Department's Division of Enforcement (Division) her arrest following a domestic disturbance on October 18, 2009 and subsequent deferred prosecution agreement on a battery charge. The allegations included:
 - a. While Respondent's spouse and his 16-year-old son (stepson) were watching television in the living room of their home, Respondent came into the room and started hitting the closet door with a hammer, stating that she was hitting the door because she was getting so mad.
 - b. The stepson grabbed the hammer to stop Respondent from hitting the door. Respondent and the stepson wrestled for the hammer and at one point, the stepson was hit in the head with the handle of the hammer. Respondent struck the stepson's face and shoulders as he tried to take the hammer away from her. When the stepson grabbed Respondent's wrist and held her down in a chair, Respondent bit him on the arm. Respondent's spouse and stepson continued to hold Respondent down while they called police.
- 5. On February 1, 2010, Respondent had a psychological evaluation performed by a clinical psychologist. She was diagnosed with Bipolar Disorder. While at the time she was doing well, it was recognized that she disease was expected to be permanent with periodic exacerbations.
- 6. Respondent has advised the Division that she has been attending domestic violence courses and recently completed a 13-week anger management course.
- 7. Respondent has not been employed since 2007 and is on long-term disability. The Division has not received any complaints regarding Respondent's practice as a nurse.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).
- 2. Respondent, by having violated a law substantially related to the practice of professional nursing, has committed misconduct or unprofessional conduct as defined by Wis. Adm. Code § N 7.04(1) which subjects Respondent to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1)(d).
- 3. Respondent's conduct as described above further indicates an impaired ability to safely and reliably practice nursing, as described in Wis. Admin. Code §N 7.03(3), which subjects Respondent to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. §441.07(1)(c).

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED:

- 1. Respondent's license to practice nursing in the State of Wisconsin, and her privilege to practice in Wisconsin pursuant to the Nurse Licensure Compact, is LIMITED as follows:
 - a. Respondent shall not practice as a registered nurse in the State of Wisconsin in a clinical setting until such time that she submits evidence sufficient to the Board, or its designee, from her treatment provider stating that she is able to safely and reliably practice.
 - b. Respondent shall continue to participate in treatment with her current physician and therapist, or other physician or therapist approved in advance by the Board. Respondent shall provide any new physician or therapist with a copy of this order and with her February 1, 2010 psychological evaluation. Respondent shall cause her physician and therapist to submit quarterly reports to the Board, in a form designated by the Department Monitor. Therapy shall continue until such time as the therapist recommends that it be ended and the Board accepts that recommendation.
 - c. Respondent shall provide a copy of this Final Decision and Order to all future nursing employers prior to beginning employment. Respondent shall arrange for quarterly reports from her nursing employer(s) reporting the terms and conditions of her employment and evaluating her work performance.
 - d. All reports required by this Order shall be submitted to the Department Monitor in the Department of Regulation and Licensing Division of Enforcement, at P.O. Box 8935, Madison, Wisconsin, 53708-8935.
- 2. Pursuant to Uniform Nurse Licensure Compact regulations, Respondent's nursing practice is limited to Wisconsin during the pendency of this limitation. This requirement may be waived only upon the prior written authorization of both the Wisconsin Board of Nursing and the regulatory board in the state in which Respondent proposes to practice.

4. Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Respondent's license. The Board in its discretion may in the alternative impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order. In the event that Respondent fails to pay costs as ordered, Respondent's license may, in the discretion

of the Board or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with payment of the costs.

5. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.
