PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Veterinary Examining Board. The Board has reviewed the attached Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Scott Evers McDonald ("Respondent") was born on August 15, 1951, and is licensed to practice Veterinary Medicine in the state of Wisconsin pursuant to license number 3738. This license was first granted on October 9, 1991.

2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Veterinary Examining Board is 18 Waverly Ave., Clarendon Hills, IL, 60514.

3. On January 28, 2008, Respondent was disciplined by the Washington Veterinary Board of Governors for documentation failures regarding a single patient, and for failing to perform surgery in a separate room under antiseptic conditions. Respondent agreed to complete specified continuing education, pay a fine of \$4000.00, take and pass the Washington State Veterinary jurisprudence examination, and permit unannounced inspection of his practice during a two year license probation period.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Veterinary Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. §453.07(2) and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. The conduct described in paragraph three [3], above, constitutes a violation of Wisconsin Administrative Code § VE 7.06(6).

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

1. Scott E. McDonald, DVM is hereby REPRIMANDED for his conduct in this matter.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

2. Respondent shall, within NINETY (90) days from the date of this Order, pay costs of this proceeding in the amount of ONE HUNDRED (\$100.00) dollars. Payment shall be made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing, and mailed to:

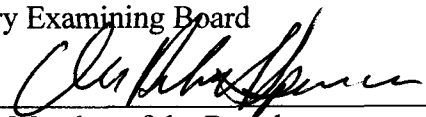
3. Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Respondent's license. The Board in its discretion may in the alternative impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this

Order. In the event Respondent fails to pay costs as ordered the Respondent's license (#3738) MAY BE SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with the terms of this Order.
