STAY OF SUSPENSION

On October 18, 2011, the Board of Nursing considered the respondent's request for a stay of suspension of her registered nurse license pursuant to the Final Decision and Order of the Board dated March 4, 2004. In addition to consideration of respondent's request for a stay of suspension, the Board received a report from the department monitor regarding the respondent's failure to comply with the drug testing requirements under the order. Based upon all of the information presented, the Board now finds and makes the following:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the request for a stay of suspension is DENIED and Madge M. Krueger's registered nurse license (#105822-30) is SUSPENDED for an indefinite period.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that respondent shall have three (3) months successful compliance with the Board order prior to submitting a petition for a stay of suspension.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that respondent may request, within 45 days of the date of this Order, an opportunity for a hearing in accordance with the procedures set forth in ch. RL 1, Wis. Admin. Code. The request for a hearing shall include a specific description of the mistake in fact or law which constitutes reasonable grounds for reversing the decision to deny the extension of the stay. If a mistake in fact is asserting, the request shall include a concise statement of the essential facts which petitioner intends to prove at the hearing.

This Order is effective five (5) days from the date hereof.
