On November 18, 2009, the Barbering and Cosmetology Examining Board ordered Respondent to pay costs and a forfeiture totaling \$2,100.00 by monthly installment within 10 months from the date of the order. On May 2, 2011, finding that Respondent had failed to comply with the November 18, 2009 order, the Board suspended Respondent's Barbering and Cosmetology Manager's license until the full amount of those costs, forfeiture, and interest was paid.

On May 18, 2011, Respondent petitioned the Board to stay the suspension of her license, and to allow her to fulfill her costs and forfeiture obligation in 12 equal monthly payments. Having considered Respondent's petition, the Board grants her request.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the suspension of Respondent's Barbering and Cosmetology Manager's license (# 21145-81) is stayed as of the date of this order. The Board orders Respondent to make 12 equal monthly payments to the Department until the total amount of her costs, forfeiture, and accrued interest is satisfied.¹ With interest of \$146.00, the total amount due is \$2,246.00. Respondent's payments shall commence the month of July, 2011. Any failure to comply with the terms of this order will result in the immediate lifting of the stay of her suspension without further notice or order of the Board.
