PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board of Nursing. The Board has reviewed the attached Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Shelly L. Lato, R.N., (DOB 07/04/1970) is duly licensed as a registered nurse in the State of Wisconsin (license # 30-156989). This license was first granted on February 16, 2007.

2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Board of Nursing is 3831 S. 93rd Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, 53228.

3. At all relevant times, Respondent was working as a home health nurse for Heartland Home Health Care & Hospice.

4. In the course of her duties, Respondent reported home visits for up to five patients that included vital signs, assessments, dressing changes and other cares. According to the patients, vitals were not taken, assessments did not occur, and their signatures were forged on visit notes. At other times, according to the patients, Respondent documented visits that did not occur at all. Respondent did not inform the physician of any missed cares.

5. According to patients, Respondent brought her child along on some patient visits.

6. Respondent denies the allegations although she does admit that the record keeping during the employment at issue could have been better which would have resolved theses issues, but enters into this stipulation and order for purposes of resolving this matter without further expense.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. The conduct described in paragraphs 4-5 above constitutes a violation of Wisconsin Administrative Code §§ N 7.03(1) and N 7.04(13) and subjects Respondent to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1)(c) and (d).

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED:

1. Shelly L. Lato, R.N., is REPRIMANDED.

2. The license of Shelly L. Lato, R.N. to practice nursing in the state of Wisconsin, and her privilege to practice in Wisconsin pursuant to the Nurse Licensure Compact, is LIMITED as follows:

(a) Within ninety (90) days of the date of this Order, Respondent, at her own expense, shall complete six (6) hours of pre-approved continuing education in nursing ethics, and six (6) hours of pre-approved continuing education in record keeping. Respondent is responsible for finding

appropriate courses and submitting the course information to the Board for approval prior to taking the course.

- (b) For at least two years from the date of this order, Respondent shall work only under direct supervision, and only in a work setting pre-approved by the Board. Respondent shall not work in a home health, agency or pool position. Notwithstanding that restriction, Respondent's current position at Hospice Advantage is approved, provided that her job description remains unchanged from the date of this order.
- (c) For a period of at least two (2) years from the date of this order, Respondent shall arrange for quarterly reports from her nursing employer(s) reporting the terms and conditions of her employment and evaluating her work performance. These reports shall be submitted to the Department Monitor in the Department of Regulation and Licensing Division of Enforcement, at P.O. Box 8935, Madison, Wisconsin, 53708-8935.
- (d) Respondent shall notify the Department Monitor of any change of nursing employment during the time in which the Order is in effect. Notification shall occur within fifteen (15) days of a change of employment and shall include an explanation of the reasons for the change.

3. Pursuant to Uniform Nurse Licensure Compact regulations, Respondent's nursing practice under her Wisconsin license is limited to Wisconsin during the pendency of this limitation. This requirement may be waived only upon the prior written authorization of both the Wisconsin Board of Nursing and the regulatory board in the state in which Respondent proposes to practice.

4. Respondent shall, within 180 days of the date of this Order, pay to the Department of Regulation and Licensing costs of this proceeding in the amount of One Thousand Dollars (1000.00), pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.22(2).

5. All payments, reports and other correspondence shall be directed to the Department Monitor, as follows:

6. Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of

Respondent's license. The Board in its discretion may in the alternative impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order. In the event that Respondent fails to pay costs as ordered, Respondent's license may, in the discretion of the Board or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with the terms of this Order.

7. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.
