# Division of Enforcement Case No. 10 NUR 675

The Petition for Summary Suspension of January 21, 2011, noticed to be presented at 10:00 a.m. on January 27, 2011, came on for hearing before the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board) at the time and place noticed. Attorney Jeanette Lytle appeared for the Complainant, Department of Regulation and Licensing, Division of Enforcement. Respondent did not appear.

The Board having considered the sworn affidavit of paralegal Beth Cramton regarding service; the sworn Petition for Summary Suspension; the sworn affidavit of Consumer Protection Investigator Tara Albedyll; and, having heard the arguments of counsel, hereby makes the following:

## **FINDINGS OF FACT**

- 1. On January 21, 2011, Paralegal Beth Cramton served on Respondent the Notice of Petition for Summary Suspension, dated January 21, 2011, and the Petition for Summary suspension, dated January 21, 2011, by mailing a true and accurate copy of those documents by regular mail and certified mail.
- 2. Marisa L. Asleson, L.P.N., Respondent, date of birth May 29, 1981, is licensed by the Wisconsin Board of Nursing as a practical nurse pursuant to license number 31-305151, which was first granted July 15, 2004.
- 3. Respondent's last address reported to the Department of Regulation and Licensing is 165 5<sup>th</sup> Street, Bonita Springs, Florida, 34134.
- 4. Division of Enforcement case number 10 NUR 675 was opened based on information received from the Florida Board of Nursing that Respondent had been terminated from their treatment program for impaired professionals, for non-compliance with her contract.
- 5. Respondent was the subject of a previous Wisconsin Board action, based on convictions for fraudulently obtaining controlled substances. Respondent was reprimanded, and her license was limited to require her to continue to successfully participate in the Florida treatment program for impaired professionals. The Order stated: "Any violations of the contract for participation in the Impaired Practitioner Program/Intervention Project for Nurses in the state

of Florida or any violations of this Final Decision and Order shall constitute a basis for the summary suspension of Marisa L. Asleson's license to practice as a licensed practical nurse in the State of Wisconsin."

## **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 1. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07.
- 2. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has authority to summarily suspend a license to practice nursing pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.53(3), and Wis. Admin. Code § RL 6.
- 3. There is probable cause to believe that Respondent has engaged in or is likely to engage in conduct such that the public health, safety or welfare imperatively requires emergency suspension of Respondent's license to practice nursing.

# <u>ORDER</u>

IT IS ORDERED that the license of Marisa L. Asleson, L.P.N., to practice nursing in the state of Wisconsin is summarily suspended, effective immediately upon Respondent receiving actual notice of this summary order or upon service of this summary suspension order upon Respondent under § RL 6.06(3), Wis. Admin. Code, whichever is sooner.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this Order continues to be in effect until the effective date of a final order and decision in the pending disciplinary proceeding against Respondent, unless otherwise ordered by the Board.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Respondent is hereby notified of her right, pursuant to Wis. Adm. Code § RL 6.09, to request a hearing to show cause why this summary suspension order should not be continued and is further notified that any request for a hearing to show cause should be filed with the Wisconsin Board of Nursing, 1400 East Washington Avenue, P.O. Box 8935, Madison, Wisconsin 53708.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in the event that Respondent requests a hearing to show cause why the summary suspension should not be continued, that hearing shall be scheduled to be heard on a date within 20 days of receipt by the Board of Respondent's request for hearing, unless Respondent requests or agrees to a later time for the hearing.
