PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board of Nursing. The Board has reviewed the attached Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Kristi L. Sorenson, R.N., (DOB 10/29/1967) is licensed as a professional nurse in the State of Wisconsin (license # 30-132095). This license was first granted on April 30, 1999.

2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Board of Nursing is 2853 Aaker Road, Stoughton, Wisconsin, 53589.

3. On or about March 24, 2010, Respondent was terminated from her position as a home health nurse after the agency that employed her conducted surveillance on its employees and discovered that she was billing for home visits that she had not conducted and/or billing for more time than she actually spent doing home visits.

4. Respondent states that she did all home visits assigned to her, but did not always accurately document when those visits occurred. She also states that she added time spent at home doing paperwork onto her visit time documentation, which may have given the appearance of over-billing.

5. An audit of Respondent's patient documentation identified incomplete and untimely documentation.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. The conduct described in paragraphs 3 - 5 above constitutes a violation of Wisconsin Administrative Code § N 7.03(1) and subjects Respondent to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1)(c).

ORDER

IT IS ORDERED:

1. Kristi L. Sorenson, R.N. is REPRIMANDED.
2. The license of Kristi L. Sorenson, R.N., to practice nursing in the state of Wisconsin, and her privilege to practice in Wisconsin pursuant to the Nurse Licensure Compact, are LIMITED as follows:
 - a. Respondent, at her own expense, shall complete three (3) hours of pre-approved continuing education in record-keeping, and three (3) hours of pre-approved continuing education in nursing ethics, within ninety (90) days of the date of this Order. Respondent is responsible for finding an appropriate course and submitting the course information to the Board for approval prior to taking the course and in sufficient time to obtain board approval within the 90 day time frame, taking into account the board's meeting schedule. Respondent shall provide proof of completion of the continuing education to the Department Monitor.

- b. Respondent shall provide her nursing employers with a copy of this Order before engaging in any nursing employment.
 - c. For a period of at least two (2) years from the date of this order, Respondent shall work only under direct supervision, and only in a work setting pre-approved by the Board. Respondent shall not work in a home health, agency or pool position.
 - d. For a period of at least two (2) years from the date of this Order, Respondent shall arrange for quarterly reports from her nursing employer(s) reporting the terms and conditions of her employment and evaluating her work performance.
 - e. Pursuant to Uniform Nurse Licensure Compact regulations, Respondent's nursing practice is limited to Wisconsin during the pendency of this limitation. This requirement may be waived only upon the prior written authorization of both the Wisconsin Board of Nursing and the regulatory board in the state in which Respondent proposes to practice.
 - f. Respondent shall notify the Department Monitor of any change of nursing employment during the time in which the Order is in effect. Notification shall occur within fifteen (15) days of a change of employment and shall include an explanation of the reasons for the change.
4. Respondent shall, within ninety (90) days of the date of this Order, pay to the Department of Regulation and Licensing costs of this proceeding in the amount of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.22(2).

6. Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Respondent's license. The Board in its discretion may in the alternative impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order. In the event that Respondent fails to pay costs as ordered, Respondent's license may, in the discretion of the Board or its designee, be

SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with the terms of this Order.

7. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.
