PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Chandra S. Reddy, M.D. (D.O.B. May 1, 1961), holds a license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin (#47052-20) which was first granted on June 21, 2004. Respondent's registration to practice under that license expires October 31, 2011.

2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board is 425 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Baraboo, WI 53913.

3. On November 5, 2010 the State of Washington Department of Health Medical Quality Assurance Commission issued an Agreed Order placing Respondent's license to practice as a physician in the state of Washington on probation for one (1) year, with the following terms and/or conditions:

- a. Respondent shall observe ten (10) heart and lung exams performed on female patients within six (6) months of the effective date of the Agreed Order;
- b. Respondent shall offer a gown and a chaperone to any patient for whom he performs a physical examination; and shall work with a representative of the Commission to allow inspection of medical records to ensure the documentation as such;
- c. Respondent will attend and successfully complete a two-day ethics course within 180 days of the effective date of the Agreed Order; and
- d. Respondent shall appear before the Commission to present proof of compliance.

4. The basis for the state of Washington discipline was as follows:

- a. Between September 2007 and January 2009, Respondent saw Patients A, B, and C. During a visit, Respondent's conduct surrounding his physical examination of each patient was not in compliance with the accepted standard of care for a heart and lung examination. It seemed to Patients A, B, and C to be more like a breast examination and was offensive to them.
- b. Respondent did not adequately communicate with Patients A, B, and C, his manner was gruff and the way he held the stethoscope was not the technique utilized by physicians in the United States.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Medical Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 448.02(3), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. Respondent by having had disciplinary action taken against his Washington license to practice medicine and surgery by the State of Washington Department of Health Medical Quality Assurance Commission, as set out above, has committed unprofessional

conduct as defined by Wis. Admin. Code § Med 10.02(2)(q) and is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 448.02(3).

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the attached Stipulation of the parties is accepted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Chandra S. Reddy, M.D., is REPRIMANDED for the above conduct.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the license of Chandra S. Reddy, M.D., to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin is LIMITED as follows:

1. Respondent shall comply fully with all conditions and limitations placed on his Washington license.
2. Respondent shall notify the Department of Regulation and Licensing of any changes to his Washington Agreed Order within 10 days of the change.
3. Upon Respondent providing proof sufficient to the Board, or its designee, that he has successfully complied with all terms and conditions of the Washington Agreed Order, the Board or its designee shall issue an Order removing this limitation of Respondent's license.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

4. Respondent shall within 90 days of this Order pay costs of this proceeding in the amount of ONE HUNDRED FIFTY (\$150.00) dollars. Payment shall be made to the Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing, and mailed to:

5. Violation of any terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Respondent's license. The Board in its discretion may in the alternative impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order. In the event Respondent fails to timely submit payment of the costs as ordered, the Respondent's license (No. 47052) may, in the discretion of the board or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with payment of the costs.

6. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.
