PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board of Nursing. The Board has reviewed the attached Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Regina Swenson, R.N., (D.O.B. 1/31/1978) is licensed as a professional nurse in the State of Wisconsin (license # 30-140260). This license was first granted on February 14, 2002.

2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Board of Nursing is 1634 Delaware Blvd., Madison, WI 53704-1818.

COUNT I

3. On or about Tuesday, October 19, 2010, in the City of Fitchburg, Dane County, Wisconsin, Respondent did intentionally enter a dwelling, without the consent of the person in lawful possession of the place, and with intent to steal, contrary to Wis. Stats. §§ 943.10(1m)(a) and 939.50(3)(f), a Class F Felony.

4. This was the home of a former patient of Respondent's. Respondent learned of the existence and location of the medication, during the course of her employment as a nurse, and because of the nurse-patient relationship she had with the victim.

5. Respondent did in fact steal a quantity of a prescription medication, gabapentin, which was the property of the patient, without the patient's consent and with intent to permanently deprive the patient of possession of the medication.

6. Respondent had in 2010, also entered this patient's house and taken medication, without consent.

7. On February 23, 2011 Respondent pled guilty to one count of burglary, a Class F Felony. Entry of a judgment of conviction was deferred, and Respondent was permitted to enter a "drug court" program, under terms and conditions, including: that Respondent shall surrender her nursing license.

COUNT II

8. On 10/16/2007, 11/6/2007, 12/4/2007, and 1/7/2008, Respondent provided prescriptions to a pharmacist, which purported to be prescription orders for an oxycodone product and/or a fentanyl product, both of which are Schedule II controlled substances, which were prescribed to Respondent.

9. The orders had been altered by Respondent to specify a dispensing date of the date they were presented (instead of the date specified by the prescriber, which was a future date), and, in the case of the fentanyl prescriptions, to increase the strength of the dosage unit from 12 mcg/hr to 50 or 100 mcg/hr.

10. On all occasions except the last, Respondent received the medications based on the altered prescription orders.

11. When questioned by a police detective, Respondent stated that she had no idea how the orders came to be altered, and suggested that a person or persons unknown had removed them from her purse, altered them, and replaced them into her purse.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. The conduct described in count I, above, constitutes a violation of Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.04(12) and subjects Respondent to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1)(d). Such conduct constitutes unprofessional conduct within the meaning of the Code and statutes.

3. The conduct described in count II, above, constitutes a violation of Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.04(1) and (2) and subjects Respondent to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1)(d). Such conduct constitutes unprofessional conduct within the meaning of the Code and statutes.

<u>ORDER</u>

IT IS ORDERED:

1. The SURRENDER of the license of Regina Swenson to practice nursing in the State of Wisconsin is hereby accepted.

2. The SURRENDER of the privilege of Regina Swenson to practice nursing in the State of Wisconsin under another state license pursuant to the Nurse Licensure Compact is hereby accepted.

3. In the event that Respondent ever reapplies for licensure as a nurse in Wisconsin Respondent shall, prior to such application, pay costs of this proceeding in the amount of one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00). Payment shall be made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing, and mailed to:
