PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board of Nursing. The Board has reviewed the attached Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Amanda K. Metz, R.N., (DOB 04/07/1981) is licensed as a professional nurse in the State of Wisconsin (license no. 150531-30). This license was first granted on April 28, 2005.

- 2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Board of Nursing is 425 Shelley Drive, Racine, WI 53405.
- 3. At all times relevant, Respondent was employed as a professional nurse at Aurora St. Luke's South Shore ("Aurora"), in Cudahy, Wisconsin.
- 4. An AcuDose audit revealed that for the period of September 1 December 31, 2008, Respondent reported a high transaction withdrawal rate for Percocet with documentation errors related to Percocet. The failure to properly document narcotic medication withdrawals deviates from standard practice and minimum competence in the practice of nursing.
- 5. The investigation of this matter yielded no evidence of Respondent's diversion of narcotics for personal use and current alcohol and other drug assessment reports, reports from Respondent's employer, and letters of recommendation all evidence that Respondent does not have a substance abuse or work impairment issues.
- 6. This is the first complaint against Respondent, and no additional complaints have been filed with the Department.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).
- 2. The conduct described in above constitutes a violation of Wisconsin Administrative Code § N 7.03(1)(c) and subjects Respondent to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1)(c).

<u>ORDER</u>

IT IS ORDERED:

- 1. Amanda K. Metz, R.N., is REPRIMANDED.
- 2. The license of Amanda K. Metz, R.N., to practice nursing in the state of Wisconsin, and her privilege to practice in Wisconsin pursuant to the Nurse Licensure Compact, are LIMITED as follows:
 - a. Respondent, at her own expense, shall complete four (4) hours of preapproved continuing education in safe medication dispensing and documentation, within 90 days of the date of this Order. Respondent is responsible for finding an appropriate course and submitting the course information to the Board for approval prior to taking the course and in sufficient time to obtain board approval within the 90-day time frame, taking into account the board's meeting schedule. Respondent

- shall provide proof of completion of the continuing education to the Department Monitor.
- b. For a period of at least two (2) years from the date of this Order, Respondent shall provide her nursing employers with a copy of this Order before engaging in any nursing employment.
- c. For a period of at least two (2) years from the date of this Order, Respondent shall arrange for quarterly reports from her nursing employer(s) reporting the terms and conditions of her employment and evaluating her work performance.
- d. Pursuant to Uniform Nurse Licensure Compact regulations, Respondent's nursing practice is limited to Wisconsin during the pendency of this limitation. This requirement may be waived only upon the prior written authorization of both the Wisconsin Board of Nursing and the regulatory board in the state in which Respondent proposes to practice.
- e. Respondent shall notify the Department Monitor of any change of nursing employment during the time in which the Order is in effect. Notification shall occur within fifteen (15) days of a change of employment and shall include an explanation of the reasons for the change.
- 3. After two (2) years from the date of this Order, Respondent may petition the board for the modification or termination of the limitation. The Board may grant or deny the petition, in its discretion, or may modify this Order as it sees fit.
- 4. Respondent shall, within one hundred twenty (120) days of the date of this Order, pay to the Department of Safety and Professional Services costs of this proceeding in the amount of Six Hundred Dollars (\$600.00) pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.22(2).
- 5. All petitions, payments, reports and other correspondence shall be mailed or delivered to:

- Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Respondent's license. The Board in its discretion may in the alternative impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order. In the event Respondent fails to timely submit payment of the costs as ordered, or fails to comply with the ordered continuing education as set forth above, Respondent's license may, in the discretion of the Board or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with the terms of this Order.
 - This Order is effective on the date of its signing.
