PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considered it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Azber A. Ansar, M.D. (Respondent), date of birth October 13, 1969, is licensed and currently registered by the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board to practice medicine and surgery in the state of Wisconsin pursuant to license number 42842-20. Respondent's license was first granted November 15, 2000, and expires October 31, 2011.

2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board is P.O. Box 111097, St. Paul, Minnesota, 55111-1097.

3. On June 30, 2005, officers from the Eagan Police Department in Dakota County, Minnesota, were dispatched to the home of Respondent. Respondent had called the police, explaining that his estranged wife stabbed him with a knife as she was picking up their son that evening. Shortly after police arrived, Respondent admitted to an officer that the allegations were false, and that he had in fact cut himself.

4. On December 12, 2005, Respondent pled guilty to a misdemeanor charge of falsely reporting a crime in the First Judicial District Court of Dakota County, Minnesota. Respondent was sentenced to one year of probation and was required to attend a four-month domestic abuse program, which he has successfully completed.

5. On October 16, 2006, the state of Arizona issued a non-disciplinary Advisory Letter to Respondent for falsely reporting a crime. Respondent's medical license in Arizona is currently expired.

6. On January 10, 2007, Respondent's license to practice medicine and surgery in the state of Ohio was suspended for six months, on grounds that the misdemeanor conviction in Minnesota involved moral turpitude. Respondent's full, unrestricted license was restored after the six-month suspension, but is in inactive status for failure to renew.

7. The following states took action against Respondent's medical license, on grounds of the misdemeanor conviction in Minnesota, and the subsequent suspension of licensure in Ohio:

- a. On December 17, 2007, Respondent was issued a citation and warning by the state of Iowa. Respondent's medical license in Iowa is inactive and expired.
- b. On February 20, 2008, Respondent's license to practice medicine in the state of California was revoked. The revocation was subsequently stayed and Respondent's license was placed on probation for five years with terms and conditions. Respondent's medical license in California is inactive.
- c. On July 23, 2008, Respondent's license to practice medicine in the state of Illinois was suspended for six months. Respondent's full, unrestricted license was subsequently restored after the six-month suspension, but is currently in inactive status for failure to renew.
- d. On October 29, 2008, Respondent was publically reprimanded by the state of Missouri. Respondent's medical license in Missouri is current and unrestricted.

e. On November 6, 2009, Respondent was publically reprimanded by the state of Nevada and ordered to pay a fine. Respondent's medical license in Nevada is inactive.

8. Respondent has a current, unrestricted medical license with the following medical boards, which did not pursue disciplinary action for this matter: North Dakota, Minnesota (Respondent has a telemedicine license) and Michigan.

9. Respondent has an inactive medical license with the following medical boards, which did not pursue disciplinary action for this matter: New Mexico, Utah, Indiana, Washington and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Medical Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 448.02(3), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. Respondent, by having an adverse action taken against his license by the State of Ohio, is in violation of Wis. Admin. Code § Med 10.02(2)(q) and is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 448.02(3).

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the stipulation of the parties is approved.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Azber A. Ansar, M.D. is hereby REPRIMANDED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Respondent shall, within ninety (90) days from the date of this order, pay to the Department of Safety and Professional Services of this proceeding in the amount of FIVE HUNDRED dollars (\$500.00) pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.22(2). Payment of costs shall be mailed or delivered to:
