The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department). The Department has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Department adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Arnold Chestnut is licensed in the State of Wisconsin as a Private Security Person, having license number 108-19018, first issued on 10/31/2001 and current through 08/31/2012. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Department is 8620 West Lancaster, Milwaukee, WI 53225.

2. On or about September 28, 2010, Respondent submitted a Report of Conviction to the Department indicating that he had been charged with OWI on February 25, 2010.

3. A review of certified court documents obtained during the course of the Department's investigation revealed that on October 1, 2010, Respondent was convicted of Operating While under Influence (2nd).

4. Mr. Chestnut, for personal reasons, has elected to retire from the field of private security, and no longer intends to practice as a private security person in the future.

5. Mr. Chestnut wishes to resolve the complaint filed in Division of Enforcement Case Number 10 RSG 036 pursuant to said retirement and the surrender of his private security person license (license no. 108-19018).

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.26(6), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent engaged in conduct which reflects adversely on his professional qualification pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § RL 35.01(2) by violating a law the circumstances of which substantially relate to the practice of a private security person.

3. As a result of the violation noted above, Respondent Arnold Chestnut is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.26(6)(a) and Wis. Admin. Code § RL 35.01.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

1. The attached Stipulation is hereby accepted.

2. The VOLUNTARY SURRENDER of the Private Security Person license of Arnold Chestnut (license no. 108-19018) is hereby ACCEPTED. Mr. Chestnut shall return all indicia of his Wisconsin Private Security Person licensure to the Department Monitor, P.O. Box 8935, Madison, WI 53709-8935, within ten (10) days following the effective date of this Order.


3. Mr. Chestnut shall not seek to renew his license or certification, or apply for any other license or certification as a private security person with the State of Wisconsin, Department of Safety and Professional Services, in the future.


4. Mr. Chestnut shall not practice as a private security person in the State of Wisconsin without being licensed as a private security person in Wisconsin.

5. Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in further action against the Respondent.

6. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.
