On August 16, 2012, the Board of Nursing considered the petitioner's request for a stay of suspension pursuant to the Final Decision and Order of the Board dated August 8, 2003. In October 2009, Petitioner had received a stay of suspension in order to complete a nurse refresher course. Based upon the information of record which shows no evidence of a petition for the stay to continue once the nurse refresher course was completed in December of 2009 nor compliance with any of the terms and conditions of the Order following the completion of the nurse refresher course, the Board now finds and makes the following:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the request for a stay of suspension is DENIED.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the registered nurse license of Regina Young (#118299-30) is SUSPENDED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that she may petition for a stay of suspension once she is able to demonstrate three months of compliance with the Order. Petitioner shall submit with her petition a current AODA assessment and current medication list from her health care provider.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Petitioner may request, within 45 days of the date of this Order, an opportunity for a hearing in accordance with the procedures set forth in ch. SPS 1, Wis. Admin. Code pursuant to the Final Decision and Order dated August 8, 2003. The request shall include a specific description of the mistake in fact or law which constitutes reasonable grounds for reversing the decision to deny the extension of the stay. If a mistake in fact is asserted, the request shall include a concise statement of the essential facts which Petitioner intends to prove at the hearing.
