On January 18, 2012, the petitioner, James L. Harrison III, submitted a written request for modification of the order of the Department dated April 8, 2007, which granted a limited Clinical Substance Abuse Counselor license. Petitioner indicated that he had opportunity to supervise individuals who have certification as a Substance Abuse Counselor-in-Training credential while completing their practice hours. Based upon the information which indicated that the petitioner has been in compliance with the terms and conditions of his limited license, the Department makes and finds as follows:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT ORDERED that the request of the petitioner, JAMES L. HARRISON, III, for modification of the terms and conditions of his limited clinical substance abuse counselor license (#15264-132) is GRANTED, in part, to allow him to supervise individuals who have substance abuse-in-training certification and completing their practice hours, subject to the following restrictions:

1. Petitioner shall not provide any supervisory services to individuals who disclose that they are survivors of sexual abuse and shall make appropriate referrals for any supervisees if such disclosure is made.
2. Petitioner shall inform his employer, any supervisory personnel and any potential supervisee of this limitation and provide a copy of this order prior to commencing supervision.
3. Failure to comply with the terms and conditions of this order may constitute the basis for a summary suspension of petitioner's license under Wis. Admin. Code, ch. SPS 6 or a separate disciplinary action under § 440.88(6), Wis. Stats.
