
On August 18, 2010, the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board issued a Final Decision and Order suspending the license to practice medicine and surgery of Kirsten D. Peterson, M.D., (#20-37385) and imposing limitations that included, but were not limited to, required drug and alcohol screens at a frequency of not less than 48 times per year for the first year of the Order.

Dr. Peterson has requested the Board reduce the number of required drug and alcohol screens. Based on the information of record presented, the Board now finds and makes the following:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the request of Kirsten D. Peterson, M.D., (#20-37385), for a reduction of drug and alcohol screens from 48 times per year to 28 times per year, be and hereby is, GRANTED.
