On November 21, 2011, the Department of Safety and Professional Services issued its Final Decision and Order in the above-captioned matter by which the Board ordered that pursuant to §440.22, Wis. Stats., two-thirds of the costs of this proceeding be assessed against Respondent. The Department of Safety and Professional Services received the Affidavits of costs from the Division of Enforcement and Division of Hearings and Appeals in a timely manner. The Department of Safety and Professional Services considered the Affidavits of Costs on February 2, 2012 and orders as follows:

ORDER

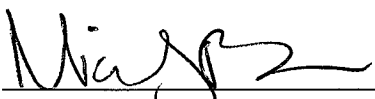
NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that pursuant to § 440.22, Wis. Stats., two-thirds of the costs of this proceeding in the amount of \$3224.92, set forth in the Affidavits of Costs of Attorney James E. Polewski and Administrative Law Judge Amanda Tollefsen, which are attached hereto and made a part hereof, are hereby assessed against Respondent, and shall be payable by Respondent to the Department of Safety and Professional Services. **Failure of Respondent to make payment on or before August 2, 2012, shall constitute a violation of the Order unless Respondent petitions for and the Board grants a different deadline.** Under § 440.22(3), Wis. Stats., the Department of Safety and Professional Services may not restore, renew or otherwise issue any credential to the Respondent until Respondent has made payment to the Department in the full amount assessed.
