By Order dated December 5, 2011, the Wisconsin Barbering and Cosmetology Examining Board (now, the Wisconsin Cosmetology Examining Board) ordered Respondent to pay a forfeiture of three thousand one hundred (\$3,100) dollars. The Respondent was to make payments in installments of one hundred dollars (\$100) per month, with the first payment due ninety days following the date of the Order and on the 15th of every month thereafter until paid in full.

According to records maintained by the Department of Safety and Professional Services, the Respondent has failed to make any payments.

Pursuant to the terms of the December 5, 2011 Order, failure to make the payment as required constitutes a violation of the Order and may result in suspension of the Respondent's licensee without further notice or hearing.

Based upon the entire record in the above-captioned matter, the Board makes the following:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Elaine Cardoso's manager license (#33950-81) is SUSPENDED until she has complied with payment of costs and forfeitures as set forth in the December 5, 2011 Order.

This Order is effective five (5) days from the date hereof.
