The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Barbering and Cosmetology Examining Board (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Dung P. Thi (dob 9/6/1987) is licensed in the State of Wisconsin as a Manicurist, having license number 7582-85, first issued on 03/29/2010 and current through 3/31/2013. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is 5726 Russett Rd., Apt #1, Madison, WI 53711. According to the Federal Bureau of Prisons, Respondent is currently incarcerated at the Dublin Federal Correctional Institution with a mailing address of 5701 8th St – Camp Parks, Dublin, CA 94568.

2. On August 29, 2011, Respondent was convicted of Bank Fraud (Aiding and Abetting), a class B felony, in United States District Court for the Western District of Wisconsin in case number 11-CR-21-BBC-01. She has been sentenced to prison for 36 months and is currently serving her term in California.

3. The conviction arises from actions the Respondent took to steal the personal identification numbers for the debit cards of her customers at her manicuring establishment, Le Nails Salon, license number 3625-71. Respondent used the information to withdraw money from her customers' bank accounts from ATMs totaling \$77,309.

4. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Barbering and Cosmetology Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 454.15, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

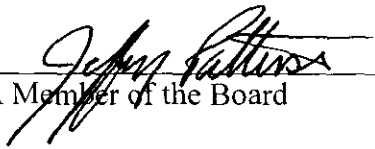
2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 454.15(2)(d) for being convicted of a felony committed while engaged in the practice of manicuring.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

1. The attached Stipulation is hereby accepted.
2. The VOLUNTARY SURRENDER of the Wisconsin manicurist license of Dung P. Thi (license no. 7582-85) is hereby ACCEPTED.
3. Respondent Thi shall not seek to renew her license or certification, or apply for any other license or certification as a practitioner of barbering or cosmetology, aesthetics, electrology or manicuring with the State of Wisconsin, Department of Safety and Professional Services, in the future.
4. Respondent Thi shall not practice barbering or cosmetology, aesthetics, electrology or manicuring in the State of Wisconsin without being licensed.
5. Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in further action against the Respondent.
6. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.
