FINDINGS OF FACT

1. CHRISTOPHER J WILSON (Applicant) has filed an application for a credential to practice as a private security person in Wisconsin.
2. Information received in the application process reflects that on or about 8/2/2010, Applicant was convicted of violation of Wis. Stat. § 947.01 DISORDERLY CONDUCT.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services has jurisdiction over this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.26.
2. The facts and circumstances of the arrest referenced above substantially relate to the practice of a private security person. Applicant by his conduct is subject to action against his license pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.26.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that CHRISTOPHER J WILSON is GRANTED a PRIVATE SECURITY PERMIT subject to the following LIMITATIONS, TERMS AND CONDITIONS:

Practice Limitations

1. Applicant shall provide a copy of this Final Decision and Order immediately to supervisory personnel at all settings where Applicant works or applies to work as a private security person.
2. Applicant shall work only in settings pre-approved by the Department or the Department Monitor.

Anger Management

3. Within thirty (30) days from the date of this Order, Applicant shall enter into a program of anger management treatment or training pre-approved as acceptable to the Department. Applicant shall participate in, cooperate with, and follow all recommendations of the provider of this program and complete the program.
4. Prior to commencing the anger management program, Applicant shall provide the person(s) providing the anger management training/treatment with a copy of this Final Decision and Order, together with the police report relating to her ordinance violations.
5. The program provider shall submit formal written reports to the Department Monitor upon completion of the program, or otherwise as directed by the Department Monitor. The reports shall assess Applicant's participation and progress in the program. The provider shall report immediately to the Department Monitor any failure to participate or other suspected violation of this Order.
6. The Department reserves the right to require additional participation by Applicant in anger management treatment with a provider acceptable to the Department, should the Department Monitor in her discretion believe additional treatment is warranted on the basis of a report(s) received.

Reporting Requirements

7. It is Applicant's responsibility to arrange for his security guard supervisor(s) to provide work reports to the Department Monitor on a quarterly basis, as directed by Department Monitor. These reports shall describe the Applicant's activities and verify that he is in compliance with the laws governing the practice of a private security person and the terms of this Order.
8. Applicant shall report to the Department any change of employment status, residence, address or telephone number within five (5) days of the date of a change. Applicant shall in addition report any arrest or conviction within 48 hours of the arrest or entry of conviction.
9. Applicant is responsible for compliance with all of the terms and conditions of this Order, including the timely submission of reports by others. Applicant shall promptly notify Department Monitor of any suspected violations of any of the terms and conditions of this Order by Applicant

DEPARTMENT MONITOR

10. The Department Monitor is the individual designated by the department as its agent to coordinate compliance with the terms of this Order. Any requests, petitions, reports or other information required by this Order shall be mailed, faxed or delivered to:

Petitions for Modification

11. Applicant may petition the Department for modification of the terms of this Order after completion of one year of practice in compliance with all terms and conditions of this Order. Applicant's petition must include his history of employment from the effective date of this Order that states the dates and names of any employer, such employment in total equaling one year of practice. Any such petition shall be accompanied by a written recommendation from Applicant's current employer that includes, among other things, the dates of employment and scope of responsibility during such employment, and (if applicable) his treatment provider expressly supporting the specific modifications sought. A denial of such a petition for modification shall not be deemed a denial of license under Wis. Stats. §§ 227.01(3), or 227.42, or Wis. Admin. Code Ch. SPS 1, and shall not be subject to any right to further hearing or appeal.


Costs

12. Applicant shall be responsible for all costs and expenses associated with compliance with the terms of this Order.

Summary Suspension/Additional Discipline

13. Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Respondent's license. The Department in its discretion may in the alternative impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order. In the event that the Respondent fails to submit quarterly reports as ordered, Respondent's license may, in the discretion of the Department or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with the terms of this order.
