BACKGROUND

- 1. The Wisconsin Chiropractic Examining Board (Board) approved a Final Decision and Order pursuant to a Stipulation signed by the Respondent, James J. Fink, D.C (license #3339-12), and the Division of Enforcement.
- 2. Pursuant to the Order, dated May 24, 2012, the Respondent's license was indefinitely suspended and had limitations placed upon it, including the requirement to take and pass the post-licensure Exam for Ethics and Boundaries offered by the NBCE and the Wisconsin State Jurisprudence Exam and completion of continuing education.
- 3. Pay \$400 (the cost of the proceeding).
- 4. By letter dated July 24, 2012, the respondent petitioned the Board (1) to allow him to take online courses to fulfill the educational requirement and (2) to grant him an extension of time to complete the examination requirement.

The Board considered this request at its August 23, 2012 meeting, and based upon the record presented, makes the following:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the Respondent's request for extension of time to take the proposed continuing education and the NBCE post-licensure SPEC Exam for Ethics and Boundaries and the Wisconsin State Jurisprudence Exam is GRANTED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that respondent shall sit for administration of the above mentioned exams and complete continuing education before December 31, 2012.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the respondent's requirement to complete the education requirements via online courses is DENIED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED the respondent provide evidence of his efforts to locate an in person continuing education course.

IT IS ALSO ORDERED that except as to the requirements set forth above, all other provisions, conditions and requirements set forth in the Board's Order, dated May 24, 2012, remain in effect.
