The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department). The Department has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Department adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Per Mar Security & Research Corporation (Per Mar) is licensed in the State of Wisconsin as a Private Detective Agency, having license number 62-4975, first issued on February 27, 1978 and current through August 31, 2013. Respondent Per Mar's most recent address on file with the Department is 1910 East Kimberly Road, Davenport, IA 52807.

2. On July 8, 2009, Respondent Per Mar was disciplined by the Wisconsin Department of Regulation and Licensing (now Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional

Services) for unlicensed practice, failure to maintain a bond or liability policy and for failing to timely update the Department with a record of its employees.

3. On or about November 28, 2011, the Department received a complaint alleging that an unlicensed individual working for Respondent Per Mar provided private security services on two occasions. Division of Enforcement case number 11 RSG 038 was subsequently opened for investigation.

4. The Department's investigation confirmed that an unlicensed individual employed by Respondent Per Mar provided private security services on October 28, 2011.

5. In resolution of this matter, Respondent Per Mar consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.26(6), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent Per Mar engaged in conduct which reflects adversely on its professional qualification pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 35.01(13) by assigning a person to perform private security personnel duties who had not been issued a license or permit prior to performing the services.

3. As a result of the violation noted in the Conclusions of Law, Respondent Per Mar is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.26(6)(a)2 and 4 and Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 35.01.

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

1. The attached Stipulation is hereby accepted.
2. Respondent Per Mar is hereby REPRIMANDED.
3. Within 90 days of the date of this Order, Respondent shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$316.00.
4. Payment of costs shall be made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services and sent to the Department Monitor at the address below:

5. Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Respondent's license. The Department in its discretion may in the alternative impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order. In the event Respondent fails to timely submit payment of the costs as ordered and as set forth above, Respondent's license (no. 62-4975) may, in the discretion of the Department, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with payment of the costs.

6. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.
