The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Medical Examining Board (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Naiyer Imam, M.D., (D.O.B. October 23, 1965) holds a license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin (#36687-20) which was first granted on June 30, 1995. Respondent's registration to practice under that license expires October 31, 2013.

2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board is Medical Imaging Specialists, PC, P.O. Box 1150, Farmingdale, New York.

3. On August 26, 2011, Respondent entered into an Agreed Order with the Texas Medical Board. This action was based on a Letter of Concern issued by the North Carolina Medical Board. North Carolina found that Respondent failed to meet the standard of care by improperly interpreting a computerized tomography scan, resulting in his failure to appropriately diagnose the extent of the patient's thoracic aortic dissection. The Order issued by the Texas Medical Board subjected Respondent to the following terms and conditions:

- a. Within one year from the date of entry of the Order, Respondent shall enroll in and successfully complete at least eight hours of CME approved for Category 1 credits by the American Medical Association or American Osteopathic Association in the subject of radiologic evaluation of chest and aorta.
- b. Respondent shall pay an administrative penalty in the amount of \$2,000 within 60 days of the date of entry of the Order.
- c. Respondent shall fully cooperate with the Board and the Board staff.
- d. Respondent shall inform the Board in writing of any change of Respondent's office or mailing address within 10 days of the address change.
- e. The Order shall automatically terminate upon Respondent's submission of sufficient evidence to the Compliance Division of the Board that Respondent successfully completed the requirements ordered.

#### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Medical Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 448.02(3), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation and Order, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. Respondent, by having disciplinary action taken by the Texas Medical Board against his Texas license to practice medicine and surgery, as set out above, has committed unprofessional conduct as defined by Wis. Admin. Code § Med 10.02(2)(q) and is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 448.02(3).

#### ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that:

1. The attached Stipulation of the parties is accepted.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that:

2. The license issued to Respondent, Naiyer Imam, M.D., to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Wisconsin (license #36687-20) is REPRIMANDED.

3. Respondent's license is LIMITED as follows:

- a. Respondent shall comply fully with all conditions and limitations placed on his Texas license.
- b. Respondent shall notify the Department of Safety and Professional Services of any changes to his Texas Medical Board's Agreed Order within 10 days of the change.
- c. Upon Respondent providing proof sufficient to the Board, or its designee, that he has successfully complied with all terms and conditions of the Texas Agreed Order, the Board or its designee shall issue an Order removing this limitation.
- d. All proof and notices shall be submitted to the Department Monitor at the address below.

4. Within ninety (90) days of this Order, Respondent shall pay costs of this proceeding in the amount of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00). Payment shall be made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services and mailed to:



5. Violation of any terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Respondent's license. The Board in its discretion may impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order. In the event Respondent fails to timely submit payment of the costs as ordered, the Respondent's license (#36687-20) may, in the discretion of the board or its designee, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with payment of the costs.
