PROCEDURAL HISTORY

The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final decision of this matter, subject to the approval of the Board. The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Donald R. Leetz, R.Ph. (d.o.b. February 21, 1954), is and was at all times relevant to the facts set forth herein a registered pharmacist licensed in the State of Wisconsin pursuant to license # 10190-40, originally granted on June 4, 1982.
2. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board is 4124 N 100th Street, Milwaukee, WI 53222.
3. On December 11, 2001, Respondent was disciplined by the Board in file 01 PHM 55, at which time he admitted to being dependent upon benzodiazepines, and to diverting stimulants and analgesics from his employing hospital pharmacy. His license was suspended for a period of

five years, the suspension was stayed, and his compliance with treatment, and abstinence was monitored. Respondent's unlimited license was restored on April 4, 2007.

4. On March 19, 2012, his employer, the Community Memorial Hospital Outpatient Pharmacy, Menomonee Falls, Wisconsin, discovered, and respondent admitted, that Respondent had diverted lorazepam, phentermine, and modafinil, for personal unprescribed use since shortly after his unlimited license had been restored in 2007, continuing through March, 2012.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

A. The Wisconsin Pharmacy Examining Board has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to §450.10, Wis. Stats. and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to §227.44(5), Wis. Stats.

B. The conduct described in paragraph 4, above, violated Wisconsin Administrative Code § Phar 10.03(1). Such conduct constitutes unprofessional conduct within the meaning of the Code and statutes

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that:

1. The VOLUNTARY SURRENDER of the license of Donald R. Leetz to practice as a registered pharmacist in the state of Wisconsin, is ACCEPTED.

2. Respondent shall, within thirty (30) days from the date of this Order, pay COSTS in this matter in the amount of ONE HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$150.00). Payment shall be made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services and mailed to:
