

On May 6, 2010, the Board of Nursing ("Board") issued a Final Decision and Order ("Order") suspending Respondent's professional nursing license in the state of Wisconsin for an indefinite period. The Board has granted a stay of suspension, permitting Respondent to practice under a limited license with certain terms and conditions.

On September 12, 2013, the Board considered Respondent's request for full reinstatement of her license. Based upon the information of record, the Board finds and makes the following:

ORDER

1. Respondent's request for the return of her professional nursing license (#157390-30) to full, unrestricted status is hereby DENIED. The Board is seeking an established pattern of sobriety that may require five years to demonstrate, as originally anticipated in the Order.
2. Respondent is hereby GRANTED the following modifications:
 - a. Respondent is no longer required to submit quarterly work reports.
 - b. Respondent is no longer required to practice under direct supervision.
 - c. The frequency of Respondent's drug and alcohol screens is reduced to 14 urine screens per year and an annual hair test.
3. All other terms and conditions of the Order not otherwise modified remain in full force and effect.
4. This order is effective the date of its signing.
