On July 21, 2011, the Board of Nursing ("Board") issued a Final Decision and Order suspending Respondent's professional nursing license in the state of Wisconsin for an indefinite period. The suspension may be stayed upon Respondent providing proof that she has been assessed as fit to practice.

On September 12, 2013, the Board considered Respondent's request for reinstatement of her license. Based on the information of record, which indicates that Respondent is eligible for a stay of suspension at this time, the Board finds and makes the following:

ORDER

1. The suspension of Respondent's professional nursing license (#155872-30) is hereby STAYED. The stay is continuous, contingent upon Respondent's compliance with the terms and conditions of this order.

2. Respondent's license is hereby LIMITED, for a minimum of two (2) years, with the following terms and conditions:

a. Respondent shall practice only under the direct supervision of a licensed nurse or other licensed health care professional approved by the Board or its designee.

b. Respondent shall provide a copy of this order, the order dated July 21, 2011 and all other subsequent orders, to her direct supervisors at all settings in which she works as a nurse, caregiver or health care provider currently or in the future.

c. Respondent shall arrange for her direct supervisors to submit quarterly work reports to, and as directed by, the Department Monitor. These reports shall assess Respondent's work performance and shall include the number of hours of active nursing practice worked during the previous quarter.

3. Respondent may petition the Board for the return of full, unrestricted licensure after two years of compliance with the terms of this order.
