On September 1, 2011, the Board of Nursing issued a Final Decision and Order ("Order") suspending Respondent's license to practice nursing in the state of Wisconsin (#163100-30) for an indefinite period. Respondent was also granted a stay of suspension and her license is currently limited with certain terms and conditions.

On March 14, 2013, the Board of Nursing considered Respondent's request for a reduction in the annual frequency of drug and alcohol screens and a request for reduction of the minimum number of AA/NA meetings from two per week to one per week, required pursuant to the Order. Based upon the information of record and considering that attendance at AA/NA meetings is imperative to the treatment, the Board finds and makes the following:



ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Respondent's request for modification of the terms, specifically a reduction in the frequency of drug and alcohol screens to twenty eight (28) screens with one (1) annual hair test, is hereby GRANTED.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Respondent's request for modification of the terms, specifically a reduction in the frequency of AA/NA meetings is hereby DENIED.
