On September 14, 2012, the Medical Examining Board ("Board") issued a Final Decision and Order reprimanding Respondent and limiting his license to practice medicine and surgery in the state of Wisconsin with a number of terms and conditions. One of the conditions of the limitation required him to obtain a comprehensive neuropsychological evaluation by a practitioner acceptable to the Board. The Order further states, if the evaluation finds that Respondent has any deficits, the Board may impose any additional limitations deemed necessary to protect the public or rehabilitate Respondent.

On April 24, 2013, the Board considered the results of Respondent's neuropsychological evaluation conducted by Stephen Pongonis, Psy.D. Respondent, with his attorney, appeared before the Board and were given the opportunity to be heard before any additional limitations were imposed. Based on the deficiencies found in Respondent's neuropsychological evaluation report, the Board determined that additional limitations are necessary to protect the public and rehabilitate Respondent. As a result, the following is entered:

ORDER

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Respondent's license to practice medicine and surgery in the state of Wisconsin (#16138-20) is hereby LIMITED with the following terms and conditions:

1. Respondent may not engage in the practice of medicine and surgery in any capacity unless and until he is compliant with all terms of this Order and the Final Decision and Order dated September 14, 2012.
2. Respondent shall complete and pass the Federation of State Medical Boards' Special Purpose Examination (SPEX). Confirmation of Respondent's passing SPEX score shall be sent directly to, and received by, the Department Monitor prior to Respondent's return to practice.
3. Respondent may not engage in the independent practice of medicine in any capacity.

4. Respondent may only practice medicine under the direct, face-to-face supervision of a physician licensed and currently registered to practice medicine in the state of Wisconsin.
