The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department). The Department has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Department adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent John Holt (dob February 8, 1953) is licensed in the State of Wisconsin as a private security person, having license number 108-989, first issued on July 1, 1997 and current through August 31, 2014. Mr. Holt's most recent address on file with the Department is 6730 West Keefe Avenue, Milwaukee, Wisconsin 53216.

- 2. On January 29, 2012, Mr. Holt was charged with Operating a Motor Vehicle While Intoxicated (OWI) in Racine County. Respondent was convicted on March 9, 2012 due to a no contest plea.
- 3. Respondent was required to notify the Department of his conviction, in writing, within 48 hours after the entry of judgment, pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.26(4m)(b).
- 4. Respondent did not report his judgment of conviction to the Department as required.
- 5. On July 20, 2012, Respondent renewed his private security permit online. In response to questions regarding whether Respondent was convicted of any misdemeanor, OWI or federal state or local law violations in the last two years, Respondent answered "no."
- 6. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.26(6), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).
- 2. By the conduct described above, Respondent violated Wis. Stat. § 440.26(4m)(b) and Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 35.01(2) by failing to report his conviction to the Department within 48 hours after the judgment of conviction.
- 3. By the conduct described above, Respondent engaged in conduct reflecting adversely on his professional qualification pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 35.01(17) by providing false information in the application for a credential.
- 4. As a result of the unprofessional conduct, Respondent John Holt is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.26(6)(a) and Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 35.01.

ORDER

- 1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.
- 2. Respondent John Holt is REPRIMANDED.
- 3. Within 90 days from the date of this Order, Respondent shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$100.00.
- 4. Payment of costs shall be made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services and sent to the Department Monitor at the address below:

- 5. Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Respondent's license. The Department in its discretion may in the alternative impose additional conditions and limitations or other additional discipline for a violation of any of the terms of this Order. In the event Respondent fails to timely submit payment of the costs as set forth above, Respondent's license (no. 108-989) may, in the discretion of the Department, be SUSPENDED, without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with payment of the costs.
 - 6. This Order is effective on the date of its signing.
