The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department). The Department has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Department adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. Respondent Stevan H. Stankovic (dob September 30, 1981) is licensed in the State of Wisconsin as Private Security Person, having license number 45475-108, first issued on June 15, 2012 and current through August 31, 2014. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Department is 4407 South 20th Street, Milwaukee, Wisconsin, 53221.

2. On January 3, 2013, Respondent was convicted of felony Conspiracy to Commit Burglary of a Locked Enclosed Cargo Portion of a Truck or Trailer (Outagamie County Case Number 2012CF000706).

3. On January 8, 2013, Respondent delivered a Report of Conviction to the Department regarding his felony conviction. Division of Legal Services and Compliance Case Number 13 RSG 002 was subsequently opened for investigation.

4. On February 5, 2013, the Department sent Respondent a letter requesting information relating to his January 3, 2013 conviction. Respondent failed to respond to the letter.

5. On March 7, 2013, the Department sent Respondent a letter by certified mail requesting information relating to his January 3, 2013 conviction. Respondent signed for the letter on March 11, 2013. Respondent failed to respond to the letter.

6. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. The Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.26(6), and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).

2. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent engaged in conduct reflecting adversely on his professional qualification pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 35.01(2) by violating a law the circumstances of which substantially relate to the practice of a private security person.

3. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 440.26(2)(c)2., an individual who has been convicted in this state or elsewhere of a felony and who has not been pardoned for that felony is not eligible for a license under this section.

4. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent violated Wis. Stat. § 440.26(4m)(b) and Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 35.01(2) by failing to report his conviction to the Department within 48 hours after the judgment of conviction.

5. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Respondent engaged in conduct which reflects adversely on his professional qualification pursuant to Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 35.01(23) by failing to timely respond to requests of the Department.

6. As a result of the violations noted in the Conclusions of Law, Respondent is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stats. §§ 440.26(6)(a)2 and 4 and 440.26(6)(b) and Wis. Admin. Code § SPS 35.01.

ORDER

1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.

2. The Private Security Person license of Respondent Stevan H. Stankovic (license number 45475-108) is REVOKED.

3. Respondent shall not seek to reinstate his license or apply for a private security person license or private detective license with the State of Wisconsin for at least 5 years from the date of this Order and only if his felony conviction is pardoned.

4. In the event that Respondent seeks to reinstate his license or applies for any private security person license or private detective license, he shall submit a new application and meet all requirements for licensure then existing at the time of his request.

5. Should Respondent seek to reinstate his private security person license, the Department of Safety and Professional Services may, in its sole discretion, determine whether, and under what circumstances, a license may be issued.


6. If Respondent ever seeks to reinstate his license or applies for any other credential regulated by this Department, then he shall pay the costs of investigating and prosecuting this matter, in the amount of \$423.00, before any such application may be considered. Payment of costs shall be made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services and sent by Respondent to the Department Monitor at the address below:
