The parties in this matter agree to the terms and conditions of the attached Stipulation as the final disposition of this matter, subject to the approval of the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board). The Board has reviewed this Stipulation and considers it acceptable.

Accordingly, the Board in this matter adopts the attached Stipulation and makes the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Order.

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Respondent Dawn L. Reagor-White, R.N., (dob May 20, 1976) is licensed in the State of Wisconsin as a professional nurse, having license number 169678-30, first issued on August 18, 2009 and current through February 28, 2014. Respondent's most recent address on file with the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services (Department) is 26350 Wyandotte Street, Laurium, Michigan 49913.
- 2. On August 30, 2011, Respondent pled no contest to two counts of obtaining a prescription drug by fraud, in violation of Wis. Stat. § 450.11(7)(a), Oneida County case number

2011CM210. The court accepted the plea and the judgment of conviction was entered on September 2, 2011, based on the following:

- a. Respondent called in prescriptions for hydrocodone to a pharmacy stating she was Dr. S's nurse. Respondent was not Dr. S's nurse.
- b. Respondent went to the pharmacy to pick up the prescription for hydrocodone and was arrested.
- c. During police interview, Respondent originally lied to the police officer stating the prescription was for her father.
- d. Respondent later admitted to falsifying the prescriptions and obtaining the medication for her personal use. Respondent stated she was currently using hydrocodone.
- e. The police officer verified with Dr. S that he did not authorize the prescriptions.
- 3. Respondent was admitted into the Professional Assistance Procedure (PAP) program based on the facts above and her diagnosis of opioid and physiological dependence.
- 4. As part of Respondent's PAP participation, Respondent was required to engage in therapy and the therapist needed to submit a therapy report to the PAP coordinator.
- 5. On July 10, 2013, the PAP coordinator received a faxed therapy report from the therapist recommending modification of treatment. When the PAP coordinator called the therapist, he was informed the therapist never sent the report. The therapist reviewed a copy of the report and stated it was not her handwriting or signature and that the document was forged.
- 6. On August 5, 2013, Respondent called the PAP coordinator and admitted the report was fraudulent.
 - 7. Based on the fraudulent report, Respondent was dismissed from PAP.
- 8. In resolution of this matter, Respondent consents to the entry of the following Conclusions of Law and Order.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. The Wisconsin Board of Nursing has jurisdiction to act in this matter pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07, and is authorized to enter into the attached Stipulation pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 227.44(5).
- 2. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 961.18(5)(d), hydrocodone of not more than 15 mg per dosage unit, is a schedule III controlled substance for which, under the circumstances at issue, a prescription is required pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 961.38(3).

- 3. Pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 961.16(2)(a)7., hydrocodone more than 15 mg per dosage unit, is a schedule II controlled substance for which, under the circumstances at issue, a prescription is required pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 961.38(2).
- 4. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Dawn L. Reagor-White, R.N., engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined in Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.04(1) by violating a law substantially related to the practice of professional nursing.
- 5. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Dawn L. Reagor-White, R.N., engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined in Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.04(2) by obtaining any drug other than in the course of legitimate practice or as otherwise prohibited by law.
- 6. By the conduct described in the Findings of Fact, Dawn L. Reagor-White, R.N., engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined in Wis. Admin. Code § N 7.04(8) by impersonating another licensee.
- 7. As a result of the above conduct, Dawn L. Reagor-White, R.N., is subject to discipline pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(1)(b) and (d).

ORDER

- 1. The attached Stipulation is accepted.
- 2. The license of Dawn L. Reagor-White, R.N., (license no. 169678-30) to practice as a professional nurse in the State of Wisconsin, and her privilege to practice in Wisconsin pursuant to the Nurse Licensure Compact, is REVOKED. Respondent may not petition for reinstatement of her professional nursing license pursuant to Wis. Stat. § 441.07(2) earlier than one year from the date of revocation.
- 3. Within 120 days from the date of this Order, Respondent shall pay COSTS of this matter in the amount of \$250.00.
- 4. Payment of costs shall be made payable to the Wisconsin Department of Safety and Professional Services and sent to the Department Monitor at the address below:

Violation of any of the terms of this Order may be construed as conduct imperiling public health, safety and welfare and may result in a summary suspension of Respondent's license without further notice or hearing, until Respondent has complied with payment of the costs and terms of the order above.

Respondent Dawn L. Reagor-White, R.N., and the Division of Legal Services and Compliance, Department of Safety and Professional Services stipulate as follows:

- 1. This Stipulation is entered into as a result of a pending investigation by the Division of Legal Services and Compliance. Respondent consents to the resolution of this investigation by Stipulation.
- 2. Respondent understands that by signing this Stipulation, Respondent voluntarily and knowingly waives the following rights:
 - the right to a hearing on the allegations against Respondent, at which time the State has the burden of proving those allegations by a preponderance of the evidence;
 - the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against Respondent;
 - the right to call witnesses on Respondent's behalf and to compel their attendance by subpoena;
 - the right to testify on Respondent's own behalf;
 - the right to file objections to any proposed decision and to present briefs or oral arguments to the officials who are to render the final decision;
 - the right to petition for rehearing; and
 - all other applicable rights afforded to Respondent under the United States Constitution, the Wisconsin Constitution, the Wisconsin Statutes, the Wisconsin Administrative Code, and other provisions of state or federal law.
- 3. Respondent is aware of Respondent's right to seek legal representation and has been provided an opportunity to obtain legal counsel before signing this Stipulation.
- 4. Respondent agrees to the adoption of the attached Final Decision and Order by the Wisconsin Board of Nursing (Board). The parties to the Stipulation consent to the entry of the attached Final Decision and Order without further notice, pleading, appearance or consent of the parties. Respondent waives all rights to any appeal of the Board's order, if adopted in the form as attached.

- 5. If the terms of this Stipulation are not acceptable to the Board, the parties shall not be bound by the contents of this Stipulation, and the matter shall then be returned to the Division of Legal Services and Compliance for further proceedings. In the event that the Stipulation is not accepted by the Board, the parties agree not to contend that the Board has been prejudiced or biased in any manner by the consideration of this attempted resolution.
- 6. The parties to this Stipulation agree that the attorney or other agent for the Division of Legal Services and Compliance and any member of the Board ever assigned as an advisor in this investigation may appear before the Board in open or closed session, without the presence of Respondent, for purposes of speaking in support of this agreement and answering questions that any member of the Board may have in connection with deliberations on the Stipulation. Additionally, any such advisor may vote on whether the Board should accept this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
- 7. Respondent is informed that should the Board adopt this Stipulation, the Board's Final Decision and Order is a public record and will be published in accordance with standard Department procedure.
- 8. The Division of Legal Services and Compliance joins Respondent in recommending the Board adopt this Stipulation and issue the attached Final Decision and Order.
