On August 30, 2007, the Wisconsin Board of Nursing ("Board") issued a Final Decision and Order ("Order") suspending Respondent's professional nursing license for an indefinite period. Respondent has been granted a stay of suspension and his license is currently limited with certain terms and conditions.

On May 8, 2014, the Board considered Respondent's request for the return of full licensure or, in the alternative, termination of quarterly work reports and a reduction in the frequency of drug and alcohol screens. Respondent appeared with his attorney in support of his request. Based upon the information of record, the Board finds and makes the following:

ORDER

1. Respondent's request for the return of his license (#90439-30) to full, unrestricted status is hereby DENIED due to insufficient time under the Order to demonstrate adequate compliance following the suspension of his license from April 27, 2011 to March 24, 2014.
2. Respondent's request for termination of the quarterly work report requirement is hereby DENIED due to insufficient time under the Order to demonstrate adequate compliance following the suspension of his license from April 27, 2011 to March 24, 2014.
3. Respondent's request for a reduction in drug and alcohol tests is GRANTED and the frequency is hereby reduced to 36 per year.
4. All other terms and conditions of the Order not otherwise modified remain in full force and effect.
5. This order is effective the date of its signing.
