On August 14, 2013, the Wisconsin Medical Examining Board ("Board") issued a Final Decision and Order ("Order") suspending Respondent's license to practice medicine and surgery for an indefinite period. Respondent has been granted a stay of suspension and his license is currently limited with certain terms and conditions.

On September 17, 2014, the Board considered Respondent's request for reduction in the number of drug and alcohol tests and also to be allowed to work in a setting where he has access to controlled substances. Based upon the information of record, the Board finds and makes the following:

ORDER

1. Respondent's request for reduction in drug screens is hereby GRANTED. The Respondent is now required to test at a rate of no less than 36 (thirty six) times per year.

2. Respondent's request to be allowed to work in a setting where he has access to controlled substances is hereby DENIED. Reason for denial is not enough time under compliance with the current order. The next time the Respondent may petition for a change regarding being allowed to work in a setting where he has access to controlled substances is March 31, 2015.

3. All other terms and conditions of the Order not otherwise modified remain in full force and effect.

4. This order is effective the date of its signing.
